Congratulations to Mrs Leathea Stephenson, the recipient of the Child of Cannington Award for 2017. Read about it on page 19.





# 'Cannington Open Gardens' 2017




and parents-to-be, those in need of social interaction, the hungry, teens and pre-teens. We try to extend hospitality and God's gracious love to all.







#### Don't be fooled by Council Tax scammers

A phone call that promises to lower your Council Tax banding for a fee of up £120 may sound like

a great offer, but you can find out if your band can be lowered for free.

Sedgemoor District Council is warning residents to be aware of Council Tax scammers who may

offer you deals to reduce monthly payments or reduce your banding. SDC has taken calls from

worried residents, so are warning everyone not to be duped.

One current scam that has been bought to the district council's attention is from a company claiming to be called 'All Claim Solutions' who say they are calling on behalf of the Valuation Office or Sedgemoor District Council and ask for £120 to lower your Council Tax banding. Please note this is not a phone call from Sedgemoor District Council or the Valuation Office, despite their phone number being very similar to that of SDC. Council Tax bands are set by the Valuation Office Agency and can only be changed under certain conditions. Details can be found at <u>www.gov.uk/council-tax-appeals</u>. You will not be charged for the service.

If you are struggling to pay your Council Tax bill and need help, speak with a member of the

Council Tax Team on who will be able to offer help and advice on 0300 303 7801.

If you have given over personal details, we would advise you to call the Police straight away on 101

and report the matter as an identity theft scam. The Police will also direct you to the Action Fraud helpline on 0300 123 2040.

#### What travels backwards down the motorway at about 12 miles per hour?



In the 1890s the key environmental concern was horse manure. London had 11,000 cabs and several thousand buses. Each used 12 horses per day, totaling more than 50,000 horses working in public transport alone. Each horse produces 15-35 pounds of manure per day; New York had 2.5 million pounds per day to shift.

Sweepers were employed to clear paths through the dung, which was either sludge in wet weather or a

fine powder which blew about in the dry. The piles of manure produced huge numbers of flies, which spread typhoid fever and other diseases; one estimate is that three billion flies hatched in horse manure per day in US cities in 1900, and in NY, 20,000 deaths per year were blamed on manure.

But now we have high powered motor cars capable of over 120 miles per hour. However, the average speed of traffic in London today is 9mph. The average speed of a London carriage in 1830 was also 9mph!

And now we have a different problem. On the motorways traffic that grinds to a halt and then restarts for no apparent reason is one of the biggest causes of frustration for drivers. Researchers at Bristol University have showed that 'phantom jams' (or 'jamitons') are caused by 'shock wave' effects with some similarities to fluid dynamics. Basically, one car stops or brakes heavily. The following car does the same and so on. By the time this has rippled back, the car at the front has moved off. But the time it takes for each car thereafter to start off again is slower than the time it takes for more cars to join the back of the ever-growing queue. Given the right conditions, a touch to the brake by a single driver may be enough to start a wave of congestion that then travels slowly backwards down the motorway, typically at 12 miles per hour.

The annual costs of congestion in terms of time and fuel are estimated at \$100 billion in the US and £8 billion in the UK and are predicted to double within 15 years. In 2010, a traffic jam in China which was originally caused by roadworks and high demand and exacerbated by broken down vehicles and people leaving their cars, stretched for more



than 100km on a major national highway leading from Beijing. Drivers were managing as little as one kilometre per day. They passed the time with games of chess and cards by the roadside. Traffic jams are so bad in China there's now a service that allows someone else to sit in a traffic jam for you. You call the company and motorcycle arrives with two people. One stays with your car and the other puts you on the back of the bike and blasts off through the jam.

#### THE WEATHER REPORT


**April** this year did not bring the traditional showers. In fact it was an exceptionally dry month with only 11.2mm. April's average is 51.1mm. 8.4mm of this low total fell on just two days, 2.4mm on the 1st and 6mm on the 30th. Temperatures were above normal with an average maximum of 14.1c and a minimum of 4.8c. There was just one air frost. -0.1c on the 27th.



**May** was the first month this year to give a normal amount of rain. We recorded 55mm, which is just 3mm above the average. It was reasonably well distributed although 12.4mm fell on the 1st. Maximum and minimum temperature averages at 18.2c and 8.1c were higher than normal.

**Spring** this year is marked by being warmer and dryer than most years. Rainfall was about two thirds the average, while temperatures were higher than normal, particularly night temperatures. The air frost [-0.1c] was the only one this spring.

**June** brought us some summery weather, with temperatures above normal. The very high temperatures in the thirties from the 18th to the 21st were possibly a bit too hot for some. The average maximum of 20.9c was about a degree above normal, the average minimum of 14.5c was exceptionally over four degrees higher than most Junes. Rainfall was a little lower than average at 35.6mm. A very low pressure system on the 5th and 6th brought us nearly half the month's rain as well as unseasonably high winds, over 35mph on the 6th. **David Daggar**




At the end of the evening, Eloise, Evie and Olivia made their Brownie promise to become Brownies.







#### **Cannington in Bloom (CIB)**

How magnificent the village looks this summer. Judging of both the Reginal and National competitions has now been



carried out and we wait in anticipation for the results. CIB should be congratulated for their efforts. We also need to thank the volunteers, the grounds maintenance contractors, SDC Clean Surrounds and Ian Dyer for all working together. #### Construction work around the village

• The flood alleviation is now coming to a close with just some minor works left to complete

• The Cycle Path between Cannington and Sandford Corner is well underway and will mostly be constructed from the field for minimum disruption and due to be completed in Summer 2018.

• The construction of the National Nuclear College at the Cannington Centre of Bridgwater and Taunton College is near completion.

#### **Exercise Classes for the Over 60's**

There is a wealth of research indicating that exercise and activity improves health and can be especially beneficial in older people. The percentage of the UK population who are over 60 is rapidly and there are now more people aged over 60 than there are aged 18. It is becoming ever more important to bring older people together and to motivate them into becoming more active in a safe and appropriate way.

There are many specialist exercise sessions that have been developed to help older people become more active in their local community, where they can manage long-term health conditions such as osteoarthritis, Parkinson's, osteoporosis, high blood pressure and diabetes.

Many different types of classes are appropriate for 'older people' include Zumba Gold, Tai Chi, Line-dancing, Cardiac Rehab Phase IV and Chair Fit. With properly trained instructors most of these classes include exercises that can be adapted and modified to suit the needs of individuals, depending on their preferences and limitations. With an overstretched NHS, these classes help 'lessen the load' as they can provide health benefits that help to slow the ageing process down by improving proprioception (body awareness to help prevent falls), sarcopenia (muscle loss), mood, cardio-vascular fitness, cognitive function and co-ordination. They can also assist those with age-related conditions that can lead to reduced activity levels. Benefits gained may even be noted by a GP in the form of weight loss, a fall in cholesterol level, blood pressure or other disease risk factor. Some clients also report reduced stress and improved sleep and energy levels.

As an experienced fitness instructor, qualified to teach Cardiac Rehabilitation and Move it or Lose It for the over 60s, I have found teaching older people particularly rewarding. Each class has its own character where camaraderie develops and fun can be had, as everyone gets to know and support each other. Those attending can be very loyal and it is great to see improvement in their fitness, be it balance, co-ordination, flexibility or strength, as well as social aspects such as confidence and emotional wellbeing, even in those over the age of 90. The use of age appropriate music can be both nostalgic and motivating, games can be incorporated and classes can be extended into birthday celebrations, tea dances and Christmas parties.

Not everyone who would like to become active wants to join a gym. Classes based within communities and villages often suit people much better. The new over 60s class that I teach at The Green, Wembdon, focuses on flexibility, aerobic fitness, balance and strength, so that those attending are more able to do functional things for longer. For example, being able to reach for things, to see behind when driving a car, put socks on, back scratch, walk up hill without becoming breathless, pull yourself out of the bath, carry shopping bags and be generally more mobile.

Pro-active was a referral scheme that directed those in need of more exercise to exercise providers via their GPs. This has recently been replaced by a more direct system. However, many fitness instructors have noticed that fewer individuals are being referred to them, suggesting that many of those who could benefit from becoming more active are not aware of classes that are available and suitable for them. As the demands on the NHS continue to rise, it is increasingly important that awareness of the existence of these classes and their benefits is promoted as widely as possible. If you feel that you could do with getting moving more or know of anyone who might benefit from joining a specialist class do get in touch with me. 
