Quarterly Weather Report

July was certainly a month of two parts. Low pressure dominated the first twelve days bringing us 57mm. High pressure took over for the next couple of weeks or so bringing us the very hot dry weather we all remember. Five consecutive days [18th-22nd] saw daytime temperatures over 30c. Low pressure returned at the end of the month making the weather much cooler and wetter. Named



storm Evert passed nearby giving us our strongest wind of 31mph on the 30th. It's not surprising the maximum and minimum average temperatures 24.1c and 14.5c were several degrees above the expected. The total rainfall was 71.6mm [17mm above average] This brought the running total for the year to 382mm [just 5mm short of average].

August was not an exceptional month as far as the weather was concerned. Monthly maximum and minimum averages at 21.4c and 13.3c were very close to the long term average. Similarly a rainfall of 51.8mm was just a little below the average. Most of it fell in the first couple of weeks when low pressure dominated. The yearly total so far is 433mm, just 16mm behind the normal eight month total.

September looked like being one of the warmest and driest on record. There was just one very wet day [the 9th with 20.8mm] in the first three and a half weeks, otherwise it was calm and warm. 30.1c on the 7th was one of the hottest days of the year. The barometer crashed on the 27th and there followed three very wet days with a total rainfall of 46mm in the month's total of 73mm. This figure is 10 mm above the September average. The running total for the year now is 506mm, just 3mm less than average. Day and night time temperatures

were still several degrees above normal at 21.8c and 12.2c. **David Daggar**







Let's start with some good news!



Brook Street Bus Shelter

The bus shelter was replaced on 16th September and we are extremely pleased with it. The old shelter has found a good home as someone's greenhouse, which the contractors kindly delivered.

Jubilee Gardens Wall

We are very pleased with our new wall. It has been quite a journey getting the correct permissions in place but it has been well worth the wait. We would like to thank everyone for their patience whilst all this work was being carried out. We will be putting up a plaque to commemorate the wall.

High Street Defibrillator.

Following on from the vandalism in the bus shelter reported in the last Target, we were devastated to discover that someone had stolen the defibrillator on the side of the shelter. This has been replaced by the Ambulance Service. We can't understand why anyone would want to steal such a vital lifesaving piece of equipment. We will be organising defibrillator training in the near future.

Traffic Calming

There has been much talk about the effectiveness of the scheme and below is a summary from SCC of the latest traffic speed and volume data recorded.

The three key sites highlighted are Rodway (located around the entrance to the college), Main Road (located just north of Brownings Road), and the Bypass.

The Rodway site has seen traffic volumes fall from 5507 in 2018, to 3638 in 2020 and further again to 3216 in 2021. Overall, this shows a 42% reduction since 2018. Average speeds have also fallen 11% to 29mph.

The Main Road site has seen traffic volumes fall from 7364 in 2018, to 5740 in 2020 and further again to 4718 in 2021. Overall, this shows a 36% reduction since 2018. Average speeds have also fallen 12% to 27mph.

Data for the bypass wasn't collected in 2020, but the 2021 results show traffic volumes increase from 2773 to 4632, being a 67% increase.

The conclusion that can be drawn is that the scheme has been successful in reducing significantly the overall volumes of traffic that pass through the village, that traffic speeds have also reduced and are in line with the speed limit, and that more traffic is now using the bypass. I would suggest that the scheme has therefore been successful in achieving its objectives.

The full data will be published on the Parish Council website. Discussions are taking place with SCC to determine what additional measures can be implemented to further reduce traffic speed and volume.

Cannington in Bloom

Many congratulations are given to Cannington in Bloom and their volunteers who achieved a Gold award in this year's South West in Bloom competition. This wasn't achieved without a tremendous amount of effort and hard work. A huge thank you to everyone involved.

Trees

The Parish Council has an on-going tree planting programme and we have planted over forty substantial trees in the last few years



Community Payback Service

We are fortunate that the Community Payback Service has chosen Cannington for Community Service to take place. Work is well underway in the Cemetery removing all the vegetation from the



walls; they will also be painting the railings and gates at the front of the Cemetery. There are a number of further projects for them to undertake, the list is endless....

Queen's Platinum Jubilee Central Weekend June 2022

As mentioned in the last target the Queen will become the first British Monarch to celebrate a Platinum Jubilee. A number of events across the weekend of 2.6.22 to 5.6.22 will be planned including a chain of beacons on 2.6.22. WHAT DOES "COUNTY LINES" MEAN?

County lines is a form of criminal exploitation in which criminals groom and manipulate children into drug dealing. The 'lines' refer to mobile phones that are used to control a young person who is delivering drugs, often to towns outside their home county and there is a gang structure, with a language of their own, to facilitate their activities.



 $\underline{\text{Teenies}}$ – usually younger than 10 used to carry drugs/weapons between older members $\underline{\text{Runners/Shotters}}$ – aged 12 – 15 who move or sell drugs and arrange street deals.

<u>Youngers</u> – usually under 18 with some level of authority over the younger ones. Deal in class A /B drugs, set up trap houses (where drugs are made/sold) or recruit Teenies etc.

<u>Elders</u> – 18+ and in charge of running street operations including purchase of weapons. <u>Faces and Olders</u> – top of the chain, not much contact with street operations.

<u>Recruitment</u> – the strategy is to create an appealing lifestyle to reel in their victims either by giving gifts, offering protection and fostering a sense of belonging and gang membership. Once they are "hooked "they depend on the gang for survival; this can include drug dependency, money, blackmail or even violence.

<u>Who is at Risk?</u> – The most vulnerable in a community are at risk of being groomed into County Lines and these would include those barred from school - difficult home life – adverse childhood experiences – behavioural and developmental disorders - vulnerable or shy, with no confidence – previous criminal activity – evidence shows that all social backgrounds and areas can be targeted.

<u>Spotting the signs</u> – these would include, returning home late, if at all – being secretive about where they are going or who they're talking to – unexplained wealth – travel apps on their mobile phone – increasingly disruptive or aggressive behaviour – new phone constantly receiving messages and coming home with injuries or looking dishevelled.

<u>Help and advice</u> – as with any form of abuse, the victim needs to know that they will not be blamed so taking a generous accepting and loving approach is the best way to combat the exploitative tactics of County Lines criminals. Talk openly to children and discuss stories they may see on the news or on TV. Encourage them to join sports or activities clubs to keep them off the street at night.

<u>If you feel your child is at risk</u> - contact the school or neighbouring policing team on 101 and if you have any suspicions that these activities are taking place, contact the police on the same number.

New Hinkley Point Visitor Centre opens for business



The Hinkley Point Visitor Centre was officially opened Thursday 16 September by the High Sheriff of Somerset, Thomas Sheppard.

Some fifty guests were given a tour of the new centre based in Cannington Court, a restored 12th century Benedictine nunnery which combines the latest in energy saving technology and digital learning with an historic space for events and conferences.

The new centre encourages visitors to explore how electricity is created in a fun and interactive way. People of all ages can learn why we need to produce low carbon energy and how EDF is helping Britain achieve net zero emissions through the construction of Hinkley Point C and the use of renewable sources such as wind and solar power.

Jane Tomaney, Visitor Centre Manager, said: "We are very excited to be welcoming guests to our new centre, which sits in the lovely setting of historic Cannington Court. During the pandemic we have not been able to receive visitors, but our doors are now well and truly open. I'd encourage anyone interested in fighting climate change and how electricity is produced to come and explore more for themselves."

Visitors are taken on a virtual tour of the construction site and can interact with a map to check on latest progress or just watch spectacular drone footage as it swoops around Big Carl, the world's largest crane. Other exhibits include a model of the pressurised water reactor, along with an interactive challenge to produce the right electricity mix to achieve zero carbon emissions and 100% output so we all have the electricity we need.

Although it is designed for people of all ages, the centre will spark the imaginations of young people across Somerset. The country needs new engineers and scientists, and it is hoped that the centre, coupled with Hinkley Point C's education programme can lead young

people into these exciting new career opportunities. The reactor operators and nuclear engineers of the future are in the classrooms of today.

As well as school parties, the centre will cater for community organisations, trade groups, holidaymakers, students and the general public. The Visitor Centre is free to access and open between 09:30 and 17:00 Monday to Thursday and from 09:30 to 16:00 on Fridays. It is also planned to open



the doors, potentially, on a Friday morning once per month to allow the local community to have a look around.

High Sheriff, Thomas Sheppard said: "This is a fantastic centre for local people and visitors alike, which showcases the challenge of climate change and how nuclear power and renewables can help generate the low carbon electricity needed to power our green economy of the future. Hinkley Point has played an important part in the economic and industrial development of Somerset and the new power station is continuing that tradition with the latest technology. Children and adults will find the centre an educational, fun and thought-provoking experience."

Luxurious Macaroni Cheese

Oven cook a quarter each of different coloured peppers, de-seeded, for 40 minutes, until skin bubbles a bit, then cool & peel. Grate 2 courgettes including skin. Drain and keep juice for soup or stock.



Dice/chop small 3 carrots. Cook with 2 handfuls of broad beans for minutes. Spread all the vegetables out in a large oven proof dish (tray bake)

15 minutes. Spread all the vegetables out in a large oven proof dish (tray bake style). Dribble extra virgin olive oil over the vegetables.

Heat 1 litre milk/soya milk until simmers. Mix with teaspoon, 2 dessert spoons of cornflour in half a cup of cold water until smooth. Add to the simmering milk and stir over a low heat with a wooden spoon, until thick. Take off heat.

Grate 8oz/250 grammes of medium cheddar cheese. Beat this into the white sauce until smooth. Add half teaspoon of turmeric, some black pepper & a pinch of cayenne pepper. Cook a cupful of macaroni, penne or spiral pasta until a la dente (resists the teeth when bitten). Drain. Add black pepper and sea salt (pink or blue). Cover veg with pasta. Pour cheese sauce over top. Cut 8 small tomatoes into slices lay on top.

Cook at Gas 5 (180 degrees) for 20 minutes until bubbly. Serve immediately with a green side salad. For budget or quick version: cook one bag of mixed frozen vegetables. Use pasta and cheese sauce as previously. A quick, nutritious filling meal for 4. Use any seasonal veg, just be sure to pre-cook first. Keep the veg juices for stock, soup or casseroles or even give to your pet dog cold but never onions as they are poisonous to dogs. Catherine Nightingale 12.10.21



Marmalade or Jam Cake

Butter and flour or line with cooking parchment a one pound loaf tin.

110 gms of butter/vegan spread

110 gms of demerara sugar

2 medium free range eggs, beaten first

110 gms self raising /wholemeal/plain flour with 1 tsp of baking powder.

Beat all the above together until pale and fluffy. Stir in 2 tablespoons of marmalade or jam. Pour into tin, level the top. Place in the middle of a heated oven Gas 5/170 degrees for 30 to 35 minutes. Test with skewer or length of spaghetti put through the middle it should come out clean when cooked.

Leave in tin for 30 minutes to cool. Turn onto cooling rack for further 30 minutes to cool. Spread another tablespoon of marmalade or jam on top heated in the microwave for 10 seconds first.

Mix 2 tablespoons of cold water with 5 tablespoons of icing sugar (make a thickish glace icing). Drip in stripes over the top. Slice and serve. Makes a delicious creamy madeira style cake. Wont last long but can be frozen in slices if it does.

Allotments. Remove yellowing leaves from sprouts, cabbages and all brassicas. Lift and store late-sown beetroot, carrots, turnips and swedes. Check stored fruit and vegetables regularly and remove any that are damaged or rotted.

Hand dig and manure heavy clay soil. Watch out for and do not disturb hibernating hedgehogs in hedges and long grass, and under sheds if using machinery. We have hedgehogs in our allotments. Sow broad beans & hardy peas. Plant garlic and rhubarb. Mulch raspberries not letting the manure touch the stems otherwise causes rot.



Gardens. Cover ponds with a net to catch autumn leaves, with a gap of half a metre near the slope for visiting wildlife, so they don't get caught in the netting. Remove the pond net in December. Weed any plants around your pond. Clean out any debris and leave on the edge. In case of frost, leave a piece of polystyrene or a rubber ball floating on the surface.

Plant new trees when the soil is not waterlogged. Soak Sweet Pea seeds for a couple of days and plant in soil mixed with grit, for sheltered spot outside. Sow marigolds and wildflower seeds. Plant out new Clematis to climb up a tree, rose or a sunny wall. Dig a deep hole, add rotted manure.

Prune dead, dying, damaged, diseased wood & any crossing inwards or rubbing other branches. Do not prune birch trees. If really necessary, it must be done before Christmas, otherwise they bleed and die. Leave pruning of stone fruit until spring & summer.

Order seeds and potatoes. Continue feeding the wild birds with peanuts, sunflower & mixed seeds all year, ensuring they have clean water in their bird bath every day. This is a lovely time of year to wrap up and get out in the countryside or public open gardens when the sun is out or first thing in the morning to see the cobwebs or when there is a frost. 




