Quarterly Weather Report.

October can be summarised as being wet and warm. The day and night time averages of 17.2c and 10.9c were exceptionally two degrees above the long term averages. Rainfall totalled 102.8mm some 25% above average making October the wettest month of the year so far. In spite of this



there was a very dry period from the 6th to the 18th when no rain fell. The wettest day was the 20th with 22.4mm. The running total for the year is now 609mm which is 10mm above the average for the first ten months.

November may well be remembered by its last few days when we experienced strong cold winds from the north brought by named storm Arwen, although we fared much better than those to the north and east. These days altered little the fact that November was a mild and dry month for the first three weeks. Day and night time averages of 12.5c and 6.8c were a degree above normal. Although we observed some ground frosts no air frosts were recorded. Rainfall was astonishingly low at only 16.2mm, the wettest day being the 26th with 7.2mm. This puts the annual running total at 625mm, in a deficit again of some 47mm. The strongest wind was 45mph at about 4 o'clock in the morning on the 27th.

December was a record breaking month. The national press reported that the highest December temperature ever recorded in Britain was 15.8c at Merryfield in Somerset on the 31st we certainly equalled that in Cannington. The average day time temperature was an exceptional 4.5c above normal at 11.3c. The night time average was 3.0c above normal at 6.0c. There were no air frosts. Most of the 61.2mm of rainfall fell in the first and last weeks leaving a very dry mid-month

spell. This was about 75% of normal. Christmas day was the wettest day with 14.6mm being recorded. We also experienced long periods of thick cloud which meteorologists describe as anti-cyclonic gloom.

2021 was warmer than the long term average by a degree during both day and night. It was slightly drier. The 682mm recorded was 73mm less than the average annual total. The wettest day was September the 28th [24.8mm], the coldest February 11th [-4.7c], the hottest July 18th [32.3c] and the strongest wind 45mph on the 27th of February. David Daggar



RHS IT'S YOUR NEIGHBOURHOOD

You're all familiar with the work done by Cannington in Bloom but as well as the regional competitions the RHS also runs "It's Your Neighbourhood (IYN)". This is a unique scheme for community gardening groups keen to improve their local environment. Groups can be working in their local street, a back alley they share with their neighbours, or the local community centre's outdoor space. RHS "It's Your Neighbourhood" is an inclusive, non-competitive scheme, a group can be made up of any number of community volunteers. There is no charge to participate.

So what do groups do?

This entirely depends on the group. Here's few examples of the kind of things groups have done in the past:

- ♦ Restoring/maintaining a churchyard
- ♦ Improving and maintaining the green spaces on a residential estate
- Adopting an unloved patch of land and renovating it
- Encouraging residents to spruce up their front gardens, running window tub or hanging basket workshops or providing free plants to get people started
- Supporting a school garden or engaging pupils in planting projects in the wider community.

How does it work?

The wonderful thing about "It's Your Neighbourhood" is that no two projects are the same - each group chooses its activity based on the needs of the local community. Participants carry out their projects with a focus on the three core IYN pillars:

Community Participation • Environmental Responsibility • Gardening Achievement

IYN is not competitive and the assessors should be welcomed as mentors who can provide constructive feedback. The annual visits are arranged and generally take place throughout June and July. Assessors evaluate what each group has achieved and how much more could be done given the unique circumstances. Following the assessors' visit, certificates of achievement are presented to all participating groups at annual award ceremonies organised by the Regions/ Nations in Bloom.

Welcome to the second Sedgemoor and West Somerset Recycle More

Messenger. The new service is due to launch to around 70,000 households at the end of February. We will let you know if this changes. Recycle More is an important development that means doing things differently and you can play a key role in raising awareness and understanding.

Get ready by boxing clever

Recycle More works best if you make full use of weekly recycling collections. Make sure you have all the containers you need.

If you don't already recycle food waste, now is a great time to start.

Everyone can have green and black recycling boxes and food waste bins. New or replacement containers can be ordered FREE using the My Waste Services feature at www.somersetwaste.gov.uk

Info on your doorstep

Everyone will be written to twice before things change, at six weeks and three weeks before Recycle More launches.

The first leaflet should arrive in mid-Jan. It looks like this and introduces the new service, timescales and how to prepare.



A second leaflet is due in early Feb. It will include a guide to recycling with the new service and an individual collection day calendar of recycling and rubbish collections for the coming year.

A reminder of what's changing



- Plastic pots, tubs and trays
- Food and drink cartons
- Small household electricals
- Small household batteries
- New recycling container—a Bright Blue Bag—delivered to all homes.
- Rubbish collected every three weeks—as more recycling is collected every week.
- Collection day changes—for around a third of households.

Garden and clinical waste collections are unaffected. Assisted collections continue on new collection days.

Where possible, recycling will also be improved for homes with shared or communal collections-for example flats, homes or multiple occupancy.

What is possible will depend on space and access at each site. These improvements will come later in the year at a date to be confirmed.

Recycle More Q&As

We are running several out of hours Facebook "Q&A Days" about Recycle More where we will field any questions about the new service.

They will run from 7am to 7pm. Please join in and promote them in your communities and with colleagues, family and friends.



How to use an AED (Automated External Defibrillator)



Danger

Assess the situation

- · Remove any hazards
- Do not move the casualty (unless necessary)





Response

Check to see if the casualty is responsive by asking "are you alright?"





Help

Shout "help!" and do not leave the casualty Ask someone to call 999 / 112





Airway and Breathing

If there is no response, open the airway by tilting the head and lifting the chin.

Casualty Breathing Normally? Place in the Recovery Position and wait for medical attention Casualty Not Breathing Normally? Send for an ambulance, ask for an AED and begin CPR

CPR

Give 30 chest compressions followed by 2 rescue breaths

Chest Compressions

- Place heel of hand over the other in centre of casualty's chest
- · Compress the chest 30 times



ns Rescue Breaths

- Keep head tilted back
- Lightly pinch nose and blow steadily until chest rises twice

Using an AED

- · Switch on the AED and follow the voice and visual prompts
- · Remove clothing and jewellery from the casualty's chest
- Place the electrode pads on casualty's bare chest DO NOT TOUCH THEM WHILE THE AED IS ANALYSING
- The AED will advise SHOCK or NO SHOCK if a shock is advised, stand clear
- Continue with CPR for 2 minutes, then AED will re-analyse casualty
- Repeat until an ambulance arrives or casualty becomes responsive

LENTIL AND 10 VEGETABLE CURRY RECIPE

Ingredients

In a large saucepan (non stick if possible) put the following:-



1 tin of lentils drained - 2 tins of chopped tomatoes - 1 tin coconut milk - 1 dessert spoon of Brewers yeast - 1 dessert spoon of Vegan Engevita Nutritional Yeast Flakes with Vitamin B12

1 tsp of organic vegetarian marmite - 1 tsp sea salt (pink or blue Himalayan salt) added to veg stock - 1 vegetable stock cube - 1 tsp of organic low salt Marigold vegetable powder

Spices

half tsp turmeric - 2 heaped dessert spoons of medium curry powder - 1 teaspoon of cumin

1 tsp of black pepper

8 garlic cloves crushed - 1 large or 2 medium onions chopped small and microwaved, or cooked in a frying pan in a little oil until transparent

1 tablespoon of dried porcini mushrooms rehydrated in a cup of boiling water

2 fresh chillies chopped small or two dried chillies rehydrated in some boiling water,

Method

In a small non stick saucepan put one dessert spoon of Vegan spread (available from Sainsburys), on a medium heat. Cook the garlic for one minute (any more and they go bitter). Put into the lentil mix saucepan. In the same small saucepan put all the spices and fresh chilli (if using) and cook for one minute, put in with lentils.

Add any of the following to make up the 10 vegetables;

Chopped cauliflower, kale, spinach, parsnip, potato, broccoli, carrot, squash, parsnip.

Everything should now be in the large non stick saucepan. Stirring frequently, bring to a boil and simmer immediately for minimum of one hour.

Serve with wholemeal pitta bread or brown basmati rice or quinoa or naan bread and plain organic live yogurt, poppadums mango chutney. (Catherine Nightingale)







"We moved to Cannington last summer and loved hearing the bell ringing practice on a Tuesday evening. When we read about the open morning in November, we decided to go along and see how it was done. It was really interesting to see the actual bells and have a go at ringing one of them, although a lot more complicated than I'd imagined! The ringers were happy for anyone new to join them, so three of us decided to give it a go and we're all really enjoying being part of the practices each week. If you fancy trying something completely different, come along one Tuesday evening - you'll be made to feel very welcome" (Sarah)



Our new ringers also commented that before they came up to have a go for themselves, they had not realised how the bells themselves work. If you listen on a Tuesday evening you will hear us raise the bells at the beginning of our session, this is when we bring the bells round into an "up" position ready to ring. At the end of our session, we have to lower them back down so that the bells are hanging downwards, this is so that they are safe.

Capital Projects

The Parish Council recently purchased a projector and screen which has been installed in the upper hall of the village hall. This will be available to anyone who hires out the hall. We are looking to replace the notice board in the High Street with a free standing one by the bus shelter. We will also be undergoing a tree and hedge planting project in the Cemetery.

Traffic Calming

Following a meeting with Highways in November, consideration will be given to improve the traffic calming measures on Rodway.

- To convert the 1st, 3rd, 5th and 7th cushions on the Northside of Rodway to table top humps filling in the centre channels, but leaving the gaps on either side to allow for cyclists and drainage.
- To install 2 new table top humps above and below the layby just up from the College entrance.
- This will be subject to a design scheme, safety audit and costs.
- If approved, works should hopefully be completed by the summer.

Cannington in Bloom

The Parish Council has awarded a grant to CIB to help towards the cost of replacing some of the containers around the village. We are also working with them to put up signs on the village entrance signs to celebrate their success.

Queen's Platinum Jubilee Celebration Weekend June 2022

As mentioned in previous Targets the Queen will become the first British Monarch to celebrate a Platinum Jubilee. A number of events across the weekend of 2.6.22 to 5.6.22. If you or any organisation you belong to are interested in forming a sub-committee to plan an event(s) for Cannington, or if your organisation is planning its own event could you please contact Robin Phipps or the parish council clerks? The Christmas lights have been left up in Jubilee Gardens in case they are required for any celebrations. The Parish Council will be planting an oak tree in Jubilee Gardens to mark the occasion.

Parish Council elections

Have you ever thought of becoming a parish councillor? You don't need any qualifications apart from being over 18, live within the parish and have an hour or two spare each week. The elections will take place in May this year and if you would like more information on the role of a parish councillor, please contact the clerks.

Cannington Neighbourhood Plan

The NHP plan has been updated following the comments received during the Regulation 14 consultation in May 2021. The plan is now progressing through the next stages and it is hoped that it be ready for a referendum in May at the same time as the local elections.

Parking

The subject of parking comes up regularly at Parish Council meetings. We know that parking is an issue in the village but please do not park on the grass verges (a particular issue this time of year as the ground is so sodden) and on the pavements. Of particular concern is



the area in the High Street around the Spar Shop and Kings Head. We will work with the Police and Highways for possible solutions. Please be aware that the police have recently ticketed cars for parking on the pavement.

New Year's Day football match



The parish council allowed free use of the Rodway Playing Field for this annual event which raised £1,000 for Children's Hospice SW. Over £40,600 has been raised in total from the football matches, mainly for the Hospice. The New Year's Day football match has taken place for the last 38 years and we hope it will continue raising money for charity for many years to come. (Picture by Neil Lush)

Parish Precept for 2022/23

At our parish council meeting in December councillors voted unanimously to keep the precept at £40,000 for the coming year. This is the tenth year in a row that there hasn't been an increase.

February

- Place new potatoes (first earlies) on a window sill in egg boxes to chit
- Soak Sweet Pea seeds for a week, then put 4 seeds to a small pot of compost (vermiculite, sharp sand, or perlite and compost mixed)
- Sow marigold seeds
- Scrape soil from mole hills and use as readymade, naturally sieved compost for seed sowing and planting (a way to work with wildlife, rather than use chemicals or killing moles)
- Keep feeding wild birds and give fresh water every day
- Using secateurs, cut wisteria tendrils down to 10cm (4")
- When not too wet and not frosty, use the garden fork prongs to make holes in your lawn to aerate the soil and create better drainage
- Make patios safe and ready for spring, by giving them a good clean using water with a power washer
- Order any flower and vegetable seeds



March

- Scrub bird tables early in day with very weak disinfectant solution to protect from disease.
- Clean out bird boxes.
- Bury some wood for stag beetle larvae. They take eight years to mature.
- Sow seeds thinly. Keep moist and warm in either cold greenhouse or light windowsill or window box

April

- Make an insect hotel. Mason bee home. Lacewing and butterfly homes. Look at ideas on internet for bug and insect charities. Great for children and families to do to get into looking after essential bugs and wildlife.
- Divide allotment into Roots, Legumes, Potatoes & Squashes, Brassicas, Wildflowers, Fruit and Fallow spaces
- Hoe and hand remove annual weeds. Keep a few dandelions as these are the first flower food for emerging bees and insects after the long dark winter.
- Keep a scruffy corner in your space for insects, mammals and amphibians; wood pile, nettles, twigs, compost pile, dead tree trunk and root
- Good Friday. Plant new potatoes 25 cm (1 foot) apart, rows 50 cm (2 foot) apart and 10 cm (4") deep. Water really well every week. Ready for harvesting mid July.






