BBC Weather Broadcasting

<u>First Weatherman</u> – George Cowling was the first forecaster to appear in vision standing before a map on January 11th 1954 and he believed his 5 minute broadcast should be understood by "the man in the street" and added comments like, "it would be a good day tomorrow for drying clothes".

<u>First Forecast</u> – BBC Weather made its auspicious debut with a radio broadcast on 14th November 1922 and by March the following year it had become a daily event.

<u>Magnetic Symbols</u> – these were designed to give a more precise indication of what to expect and where but they were inclined to be wonky or fell off the map during the broadcast. By 1985 the symbols were replaced when the world's most advanced computerised weather display system came into operation at the BBC.

<u>Name That Storm</u> – in September 2015, the Met Office began naming storms and the BBC quickly adopted this convention. The first storm that year was named Abigail and a total of 11 were named over the 2015/2016 season.

<u>First Female Forecaster</u> – qualified meteorologist Barbara Edwards made her small screen debut in 1974 and fronted broadcasts until 1978.

<u>The Great Storm</u> – in 1987 we were reassured by Michael Fish telling us there would be no hurricane tomorrow. Sadly he was spectacularly wrong; 100mph winds resulted in the demise of 15 million trees including 6 of the giant trees that gave Seven Oaks its name.

<u>Social Media</u> – in 2010 the BBC Weather Twitter account was launched and in October 2020, BBC Weather joined Instagram. Pictures from the photo-sharing community BBC Weather Watchers (bbc.co.uk/weatherwatchers) are regularly featured on social media platforms. For full details of the weather over the last three months, there is a comprehensive report on the next page. It's thanks to the enthusiasm and skill of people like David, that we get an insight into weather trends. (Editor)

Last night, my kids and I were sitting in the living room and I said to them,


'I never want to live in a vegetative state, dependent on some machine and fluids from a bottle. If that ever happens, just pull the plug.'

Weather Report

October was a very mild month, with the dominant wind direction, unusually south east. Daytime and night time averages were 18.3c and 10.6c. These were three degrees and two and a half degrees above the long term averages. Recorded rainfall was 83mm, which exactly matched the average. The wettest day was the 23rd, with 23.2mm, but overall it was very evenly spread. Nothing has happened to reduce the annual deficit of 200mm.

November was another very mild month with daytime temperatures some two degrees above the average at 13.5c. Night time temperatures were similarly two degrees above the average at 7.6c; there were no air frosts. A succession of depressions and fronts brought a lot of rain. A total of 111.2mm was some 32mm above the average so reducing the annual deficit a little. The 21st



weather lore tells of a mild winter to come. We shall see!



December was certainly a month of two parts. The first part exceptionally cold with twelve consecutive air frosts [7th to 18th] far more than winter's total in recent years. Then all changed with a succession of depressions bringing mild and rainy weather for the rest of the month with unseasonably high temperatures in the last week. In spite of this the monthly day and night averages of 6.6c and 2.4c were

a little below the long term averages. Rainfall, mainly in the second part of the month, was 22mm below average at 59.4mm.

2022 brought us many extremes. The December frosts were exceptional with a minimum of -5.8c on the 15th. July and August brought us many high temperatures, the highest being 35.4c in the 12th. Along with these highs were long periods with little rain making 2022 overall a dry year. The annual total was 551mm

which is some 200mm below an average year. February was a very windy month with a number of named storms. Eunice gave us gusts over 50mph on the 18th.



The Meteorological Office have declared that 2022 was the warmest on record with a U.K. average just over 10c and an average for England just under 11c. Our average in the warm southwest was 12.4c.







The Cannington in Bloom pub quiz proved to be our best ever, so thank you to all quizzers, you'll help keep Cannington blooming in 2023.



Frogs and toads typically spawn from Jan to March and their spawning can be a good indication of where good quality water bodies such as ponds are, and the quality of surrounding habitats.


So from <u>January 1st to 31st March</u>, we are running a spawn count to collect important data on the location of breeding frogs and toads across the county. We want you to record both toad and frog spawn in your garden ponds, local community ponds, and any ponds you come across in your adventures in the countryside.

Did you know, frogs and toads (and all amphibians actually) are considered "indicator species"? Since

they absorb water directly through their skin, they're especially vulnerable to water pollutants like pesticides and one of the first to be affected by degradation of the environment and the impacts of climate change. They also have important functions in the food webs of both aquatic and terrestrial systems, so understanding the size and location of their populations and their breeding success is really important so we can look after our aquatic habitats within the wider landscape

Volunteer to be an Independent Visitor or

Advocate for children in Somerset.

These are fascinating and inspiring opportunities, which can bring real benefits to vulnerable

children and young people. (Travel and reasonable expenses are reimbursed.)

You can help children and young people understand their rights and ensure that their views, wishes and feelings are heard.

What is an Independent Visitor?

Independent Visitors are volunteers who befriend and spend time with a child or young person who is in the care of the Local Authority. By law all local authorities have to provide an Independent Visitor service.

In Somerset our intention is to encourage the relationship between the Independent Visitor and young person to continue beyond care. This way the care leavers continue to benefit from support, while making the transition to young adulthood. Independent Visitors are highly valued by the young people as they may be the only person involved in their lives who is not paid to be there.

What is an Advocate?

An Advocate is an independent person who can offer one-to-one support to children and young people to have their voice heard when meetings are taking place concerning their wellbeing. It's the role of the Advocate to speak up for the young person, make them aware of their rights, listen to them and represent their views, wishes and feelings.

Why not join our bank of advocates? You chose when you're available. Your volunteering can be arranged to suit your availability.

Your life experience will be highly valued and you will be trained and supported in developing key skills.





Facebook and the offer to crowd fund a replacement set. Fortunately, the Parish Council was able to fund a replacement set. This new set has 3 bulbs per metre compared to the old set which had 2 bulbs per metre and so make more of an impact. Thank you to all the volunteers who helped to put the lights up, take them down and then do it all again!


The revamped Cannington Christmas was a great evening and the turnout was amazing despite the poor weather. A huge thank you to all those involved.

High Street notice board

It has taken a bit longer than anticipated to get it installed but it was worth the wait. If any local groups wish to place adverts in the notice boards, then please email the clerks.



Pump Track

In a previous edition of the Target, we asked for suggestions for what facilities you would like at the playing fields. Three boys attended our December meeting and gave a presentation to the council on pump tracks. They would dearly love one in Cannington and it can be used by all ages from toddlers to adults, using skateboards,

scooters and bicycles. They had visited local tracks and canvassed residents for their opinions. We were so taken with their request that we are actively researching the viability and costs for having one installed at Rodway playing fields, using the funds from the S106 Leisure Fund from EDF.

Speed Indicator Device (SID)

We now have a fully trained councillor and so we are able to use our SID once again. You will notice it in various locations in the village. We are only permitted to have it in one location for a maximum of 2 weeks and it can't be returned to the same position within a month. The authorised locations are Jubilee Gardens, High Street and Rodway.

Traffic Calming

The alterations to 5 of the existing speed cushions in Rodway to full width table tops and the installation of 2 new full width table tops appeared to have drastically reduced the speed of traffic using Rodway. We will analyse the data from the SID to establish whether the volume of traffic has also reduced.

Litter bins for Rodway

We are extremely disappointed in the amount of rubbish that is being discarded in Rodway. So much so that we are looking in to placing 2 litter bins. We are extremely grateful to our local residents who regularly go out and litter pick, it is very much appreciated.

Grit bins

Our grit bins have recently been cleaned out and replenished. They are there for anyone to make use of. They are located on Chads Hill, Clifford Park/High Street junction, Health Centre, Jubilee Gardens and Southbrook. Can we please ask you not to use them as a litter bin?

Dog Fouling

Over the years the Council has purchased 10

dog bins and they are placed throughout the village, yet still some people allow their dogs to foul the highway and not pick it up. Please can the minority not spoil it for the majority? Fines of up to £500 are applicable if you are caught. We currently spend £1,400 per annum to have the bins emptied.

King's Coronation

This will be held on Saturday 6th May and we would like to hold a similar event to the Queen's Platinum Jubilee on Sunday 7th. The £2 single fare is available from 1st January to 31st March.





Is your child living with another family?

Have you been looking after someone else's child for 28 days or more?

Do you know a child that's being looked after outside their close family?

If so, the child may be living in a private fostering arrangement.

The law says you must tell Children's Social Care if you know about any private fostering arrangements. This is so we can make sure the children are well looked after and to give support to their carers.

What is private fostering?

Private fostering is when a child or young person under 16 years old - or under 18 if they have a disability - lives with someone for 28 days or more who is not a close relative, guardian or person with parental responsibility. A close relative would be a parent, step-parent, aunt, uncle or grandparent.

People become private foster carers for all sorts of reasons. They might be a friend of the child's family. They could be someone who is willing to look after a child they do not know, for example if that child is on an exchange trip or have parents who live overseas.

If Children's Social Care has made the arrangement, or the person who is caring for the child is and approved foster carer, this is not private fostering.

What to do if you know of a private fostering arrangement

The law says you must tell Children's Social Care if you know about any private fostering arrangements.

If you think you are privately fostering a child or know about a child who is being privately fostered, then don't worry, it is allowed. But you do need to tell us - we have a legal duty to ensure that all children who are privately fostered are cared for in a safe and suitable environment.

Cathy's Cheese Straws - Great for nibbles

250g (8oz) medium cheddar cheese grated

Half teaspoon of each of the following:-

Sea Salt, Cayenne Pepper, Mixed Herbs, Turmeric, Black Pepper

375g (6oz) Plain and wholemeal flour mixed

125g (4oz) butter or vegan spread

One egg beaten with a fork

Cold water to mix



Chop the butter with a round bladed knife into the flour, then with cold hands lift the fat through the flour until like breadcrumbs or use a Kenwood mixer with the K beater.


Mix in everything else. Keep board and hands cold. Divide into two and roll out into a rectangle. Wrap both in foil and put in the fridge for 15 minutes.

Set oven 400 degrees F/ 200 degrees C or Gas 6. Have two baking sheets ready.

Roll out one piece of pastry until thin. While on the board cut into 10cm (4") pieces with a fish slice and place these on one of the baking sheets. Then cut each into four just pressing down with a round bladed knife.

Bake for 15 minutes; they will separate and shrink a bit while cooking. When cooled slightly place on a cooling rack as shown above. Can be dusted with paprika to taste. Very cheesy, crispy straws.

Gardens & Allotments - February – March - April

February - Place potatoes (first earlies) on a window sill in egg boxes to chit.

• Plant a bare rooted deciduous native tree (one that loses leaves), in a wide hole. Level soil to top of roots and create a moat outside the rootball, so rainwater and summer watering can feed the water down to the roots.



Only 1 metre (3 feet) tall these 'whips' need no stakes. These are relative cheap to buy. Plant as long as ground not frosty or muddy. Sometimes available from The Woodland Trust tree charity for communities. Scientists have discovered that trees capture nearly twice as much carbon as originally thought. So planting your tree will be a small step to help combat climate change.

- Soak Sweet Pea seeds for a week, then put 4 seeds to a small pot of compost (vermiculite, sharp sand, or perlite and compost mixed)
- Sow marigold seeds
- Scrape soil from mole hills and use as readymade, naturally sieved compost for seed sowing and planting (a way to work with wildlife, rather than use chemicals or killing moles)
- Keep feeding wild birds and give fresh water every day
- Using secateurs, cut wisteria tendrils down to 10cm (4")
- When not too wet and not frosty, use the garden fork prongs to make holes in your lawn to aerate the soil and create better drainage
- Make patios safe and ready for spring, by giving them a good clean using water with a power washer
- Finish order of flower and vegetable seeds. Share any seeds due to go out of date with friends and neighbours.

<u>March</u> - Scrub bird tables early in day with very weak disinfectant solution to protect from disease Bird Flu virus and clean out bird boxes.

- Bury some wood for stag beetle larvae. They take eight years to mature.
- Sow seeds thinly. Keep moist and warm in either cold greenhouse or light windowsill or window box

<u>April</u> - Make an insect hotel. Mason bee home. Lacewing and butterfly homes. Look at ideas on internet for bug and insect charities. Great for children and families to do to get into looking after essential bugs and wildlife.



- Plant evergreen trees this month the same way as above in February.
- Divide allotment into Roots, Legumes, Potatoes & Squashes, Brassicas, Wildflowers,
 Fruit and Fallow spaces
- Hoe and hand remove annual weeds. Keep a few dandelions as these are the first flower food for emerging bees and insects after the long dark winter.
- Keep a scruffy corner in your space for insects, mammals and amphibians; wood pile, nettles, twigs, compost pile, dead tree trunk and root
 - Good Friday. Plant new potatoes 25 cm (1 foot) apart, rows 50 cm (2 foot) apart and 10 cm (4") deep. Water really well every week. Ready for harvesting mid-July.




