CHILD OF CANNINGTON 2023

The recipient of this year's Child of Cannington award for longstanding community service to the village is Colin Allen, who recently retired as chair of Cannington Parish Council. The award was presented at the Parish Meeting by Revd Alison Waters, the Rector, and the citation was written by former Somerset County Council chair, John Edney:

"After the sad death eleven years ago of Maurice Locke, the then chairman of the Parish Council, Colin, took over the reins and steered the village through one of the most difficult periods in its long history.



The development of the Hinkley Point Power Station came with as many problems as benefits and the by-pass positioning, particularly, became a major debating item at many Parish Council meetings.

The other great achievement was the installation of the Flood Protection Scheme that Colin greatly helped in the securing of the necessary funding.

The creation of the Parish Office was another valuable asset to the village, largely through Colin's efforts.

He has led the village with skill and diligence for the eleven years. He has always made himself available when emergencies occur and when village activities needed an extra hand."

Creating wildflower meadows

At the recent meeting of the Parish Council, the decision was made to create areas of wildflower meadow as an experiment to replace some of the areas of conventionally mown grass. The area chosen for this experiment is the grass area either side of the footpath leading from Main Road to Otters Brook and the centre of the grass area at the bottom of this path.



To manage this effectively, one cannot just leave the grass

to grow and then cut say once a year. This will not work, just leading to long uncut grass which will become infested with weeds such as Broadleaved Dock.

When creating a wildflower area, the level of nutrients in the soil is reduced which reduces competition from the various grass species present. This will mean, in October, killing off the existing vegetation with a selective herbicide. This will be followed by sowing with the wildflower mix in November. This mixture will include native wildflowers such as Oxeye Daisy and Campion; but also, a 'key' species called Yellow Rattle, which is a self-seeding annual which parasitises grasses to reduce their vigour.

The future programme of maintenance will include mowing possibly in the spring to reduce vigour, although this is unlikely the first year after sowing. The main cut will be later when all the herbage will be cut and removed. There will be continued mowing in the autumn to a height of 50mm to remove excess growth.




All grass cuttings will have to be removed to reduce soil nutrient levels.

This will NOT save money; in fact, it is likely to increase cost in the short term. This is designed to increase biodiversity in encouraging insect pollinators and colour during the late spring and summer.

We would appeal to all dog owners to not let their dogs defecate in these areas and to take all poo bags home or put in the nearest bin.







We recently took part in the church fete day in June offering a chance to climb the tower and see the views from the top as well as see what goes on in our bell tower, clock room and see the bells themselves.



Weather Report

April - recordings were very close to the long term average. Daytime and night time figures of 14.2c and 5.7c were a very little higher. There were two air frosts [-0.3c and



-0.7c] on the 3rd and 4th. The highest temperature was 19.2c on the 29th. Rainfall was 48.4mm, just 2mm below average. It was quite evenly spread. However there was some particularly heavy rain on the 11th and 12th when an exceptionally low pressure area passed, accompanied by named storm Noa with winds of 40mph.

<u>May</u> - will be remembered, I am sure, as we saw the early arrival of summer weather brought by a large high pressure system from mid month onwards. Daily maxima averaged

19.3c, some 2.5c above normal. Night time minima averaged 8.4c, just a little above normal. The highest temperature was 24.6c on the 28th, unusually high for May. We recorded 31.2mm of rain which is 21mm below the monthly average. There were two particularly wet days, the 8th and 9th when 21mm of that total fell. After five months we have a rainfall deficit of 50mm.



June - continued to give us hot weather. Nationally it was the

hottest June on record. We recorded a daytime average of 24.9c, which is exceptionally some five degrees above normal. The hottest was 29.6c on the 17th. On fifteen days the thermometer exceeded 25c. Night time temperatures were a couple of degrees above normal at 12.2c. The month was also very dry. We received 30.6mm, 20mm of which fell in one heavy storm early on the 20th.

Bus Service

The £2 fare on all bus journeys will continue until October 2023 and then a £2.50 fare will be introduced until November 2024. This is being done to encourage more people to take the bus instead of using cars. During January to May 2023 there was a 16% increase in the number of passenger journeys, this is very encouraging indeed. Please try and use the bus service whenever you can.

Defibrillators

Following the discussions on Facebook regarding defibrillators and how to use them, the Parish Council has booked a training session. This will be held at 7.00pm on Monday 4th September, upstairs in the village hall. Everyone is welcome to attend. Details will be published nearer the time. If you wish to attend, please contact the Clerks. Depending on the take up further sessions can be organised in the future.

20mph Speed limit

We reported in the last Target that the Parish Council would actively pursue a 20mph speed limit for the village. There has been a new initiative from Somerset Council for a community funded 20mph speed limit. The cost to the Parish Council will be in the region of £15,000 and at a recent meeting, councillors unanimously supported this. There is money available in the EDF mitigation fund to cover these costs.

Private Fostering

Is your child living with another family?

Have you been looking after someone else's child for 28 days or more?

Do you know a child that's being looked after outside their close family?

If so, the child may be living in a private fostering arrangement.

The law says you must tell Children's Social Care if you know about any private fostering arrangements. This is so we can make sure the children are well looked after and to give support to their carers.

What is private fostering?

Private fostering is when a child or young person under 16 years old - or under 18 if they have a disability - lives with someone for 28 days or more who is not a close relative, guardian or person with parental responsibility. A close relative would be a parent, step-parent, aunt, uncle or grandparent.

People become private foster carers for all sorts of reasons. They might be a friend of the child's family. They could be someone who is willing to look after a child they do not know, for example if that child is on an exchange trip or have parents who live overseas.

If Children's Social Care has made the arrangement, or the person who is caring for the child is and approved foster carer, this is not private fostering.

What to do if you know of a private fostering arrangement

The law says you must tell Children's Social Care if you know about any private fostering arrangements.

If you think you are privately fostering a child or know about a child who is being privately fostered, then don't worry, it is allowed. But you do need to tell us - we have a legal duty to ensure that all children who are privately fostered are cared for in a safe and suitable environment.

Cathy's Recipe for Courgette Soup

- 6 to 8 Courgettes thickly sliced
- 6 medium to large Potatoes, peeled and sliced (cover with cold water to stop them going brown)



- 1 pint stock (either homemade by simmering the bones of a whole roast chicken for 20 minutes then straining through a sieve or 2 x less salt chicken stock cubes or 2 x organic vegetable stock cubes) One large or two medium onions, peeled, sliced in half then sliced in the other direction to get small pieces, cover & microwave for 2 minutes
- 3 to 4 fresh garlic cloves, crushed or chopped small and fried in small saucepan in vegan spread or unsalted butter for one minute only.
- Pour the water away from the potatoes, rinse them. Then put all the ingredients into a covered saucepan cook until potatoes are tender about 20 minutes. Allow to cool and put in blender into two batches until smooth. If no fancy equipment in your kitchen mash everything as best as you can in the saucepan.



• Stir in five grinds of sea salt, and five grinds of black pepper and add a knob of vegan spread or unsalted butter. At this stage the soup can be portioned up into lidded tubs (the kind we get from takeaways) or Tupperware and freeze up to 4 - 6 weeks.

- This is a great way to use up courgettes. Those of us with allotments often end up with a glut. One plant produces loads of courgettes. Any other vegetable can be used to same way to give a wholesome filling soup. Defrost thoroughly before use.
- Heat gently in a non-stick saucepan. Serve with a whirl of whipped or double cream. (Whipping cream and double cream can also be frozen for one month). Whip or beat first until it is stiff in the bowl, then out into a piping bag with a large star nozzle. If you don't have one of these it's worth investing in one and a few nozzles.
- Great for children too, for royal icing and mashed potato. Fold the top of the bag tightly over and squeeze fifty pence sized whorls onto a baking sheet. Place in the freezer. When frozen, slide off, bag up and clip. These are then ready to use as individual portions on soups and desserts). Serve soup with chunky fresh bread.

Letter to the editor.

In HPC's spring 2023 community magazine 'Plugged In' I read with some incredulity the supposed fly parking figures for the last quarter of 2022; as a response, since the 25th of April I've been diligently logging and reporting to EDF Hinkley Point Enquiries on a daily basis registration numbers and times etc. of fly parking in Church Street/Bowling Green between the hours of 5.00 and 7.00am; in just over two weeks the total was thirty-eight: HPC figures for the last quarter of 2022 for Bridgwater and surrounding villages, thirty-seven.

Initially I would phone EDF HPE and report a fly parked vehicle only to be told " not registered, not one of ours"; this "not one of ours", wearing an EDF lanyard would then walk to the high street and get on a HPC bus to the Point, it was at this juncture that I decided a record should be kept of all communication with EDF HPE.

Feedback from Somerset Passenger Solutions via EDF HPE suggests that 80% of those reported as fly parking are not registered which means that EDF has no idea who the vehicles belong to or where the owners reside. One such "unregistered" vehicle that arrived daily in Church Street and departed at the end of the day's shift was in fact registered, and as a "local resident entitled to park," until it was pointed out that the vehicle was being investigated, i.e. contact being made with his employer to verify his address, whereupon the vehicle disappears: the residing address given I have been told was Cannington Court.

My understanding is that when working on, or having access to a nuclear site it is imperative that the correct residing address is given, and thereby known to the appropriate authorities. John French.



August September October Gardening & Allotment Tips

Cinnabar moths, Small Tortoiseshell, Common Blue, Peacock, Gatekeeper, Comma, Marbled White butterflies have all shared our space so far this year and the Jersey Tiger, fantastic looking, is one of



six types of moth that lives on and in nettles. Peacock butterfly, Comma, Small Tortoiseshell, Red Admiral lay eggs on stinging nettles, caterpillar & chrysalis feed, hibernate & shelter in them. If you provide a refuge with a little space to long grass, nettles, ivy, dandelions, chicory, dock and grasses, many bees, pollinators and insects will soon visit. Moths & Butterflies provide 1000s of caterpillars for baby birds in spring.

We raised £257 at the Cannington Open Gardens for Cannington in Bloom and every open garden showed how a wild patch can be incorporated in an attractive way. A big thank you to those who opened their gardens and all those who supported it.

August is a time to enjoy being outside. Keep deadheading, hand weeding, hoeing, mulching, evening watering and harvesting veg and fruits. This is the month for ordering bulbs for September delivery. The view from your windows and where you sit outside are excellent places to plant a show with blue Anemone blanda, chionodoxa, muscari and scilla bulbs. Short tulips and dwarfs daffodils make for low maintenance colour. On the allotment cut away old leaves of squash & pumpkin. Earth up & stake brussel sprouts & winter greens. Plant out mini cauliflowers & leeks.

September - First week, cut down wildflower patches and leave for 2 weeks for seeds to shed then remove the cuttings. Sow spring cabbage, beetroot, carrots. Store onions & late potatoes. Second cut of the year for some hedges now that it is legally allowed as all birds have fledged. Consider planting a double row of blackthorn, hawthorn, bramble, privet & hazel instead of having a fence. Moths & butterflies love these. To see it as mature hedge visit Steart near Combwich.



October - Lots to do. Lay thick layers of mulch around trees, being careful not to touch the trunk, on allotments and garden planting beds. Sow broad beans & hardy peas. Earth up leeks. Lift and store carrots & beetroots. Bring in marrow, pumpkin and winter squashes before heavy frost. Continue to harvest pears, deadhead hybrid tea & climbing roses. Cut out fruited canes of summer raspberries and tie in new canes. Prepare and water new strawberry beds. Dig up tomato plants and hang upside down in greenhouse or indoors to finish ripening. Plant perennial plants. Sow annuals. Sow biennials such as hollyhock, wallflower & foxglove.

Can you help with photographs or memories of Cannington during WWII?

Cannington Yarn Bombers are working on a project for the 80th Commemoration of D Day called the "Carentan Tapestry." This is the vision of a British lady living in Normandy. Carentan was a town which saw very heavy fighting in 1944 and will be at the centre of the 80th Anniversary D Day Commemorative events. The finished project is for 80 3D panels which will be displayed in the

town.

We are signed up to produce two of the panels which will depict the preparations and events of D Day, 6th June 1944. As many will know the US Army 535th Anti Aircraft Battalion were billeted at what was then Brymore House before going to Normandy on D-Day. One of our panels will depict the camp at Brymore House, the other will represent the battalion shipping out through the village.

It is the panel that will depict the village that we need help with. Basic information such as: What was growing in the gardens? Was tape on all the windows? Were there air raid shelters? Anything that will help us learn what Cannington may have looked like at in 1944. We have access to the Cannington Reflections Book and what can be found on the internet. We are looking for more personal memories that you may have.

- Do any of you have photographs of Cannington which would show buildings as they might have been in 1944?
- Do any of you have personal memories of wartime in Cannington or have family memories that have been passed to you?
- Do you have any relatives or know of Cannington service personnel who were present in Normandy on D Day? Part of the project is to ensure that regimental badges and national flags of those there are included.

Any help with our research will be greatly appreciated and we will treat any information or materials with the greatest respect. Please contact me with any information.



(An appeal for people to help produce the actual panels will

follow later. At the moment we are in the planning stages whilst the village crafts people are needed for the poppy project!)
