



Quarterly Weather Report

July did not continue with the hot dry weather of June. Daytime and night-time temperatures of 21.9c and 13.4c were marginally above average. However, it was a wet month. We recorded 106.4mm, which is twice



what would have fallen in an average July. A succession of unseasonal low-pressure systems was responsible for this. The wettest day was the 14th with 20.4mm recorded. Other very wet days were the 5th [15mm] and the 26th [11.3mm] Nevertheless we are still some 75mm in deficit for the year.

August gave us daytime and night-time averages just a little above normal at 21.9c and 13.9c respectively, and rainfall of 52.6mm which was 83% of an average year, however, August will probably not be remembered for being a little warmer and drier than average. We experienced a series of low-pressure areas which resulted in some rain on eighteen days. Not what we hoped for during the year's main holiday month.



September overall was a warmer and wetter month than average. The first ten days brought us the hottest days of the year. 30.4c and 31c were recorded on the 4th and 5th Five other days temperatures were just a little below 30c. Day and night-time averages were 22.6c and 13.6c some three degrees above the long term. The rainfall total was 85.8mm, 25mm above average. It is noteworthy that on the

17th we experienced a violent downpour in which approaching 30mm fell in about thirty minutes. **David**

HPC Continues an Important Tradition.

Saint Barbara's Day, December 4, is celebrated among many different professions who work with cannon and explosives. Miners and tunnellers regard Santa Barbara as their patron saint and protector. Earlier in history, the powder magazine of a ship or fortress were believed to be protected by Santa Barbara from suddenly exploding.

Santa Barbara was an early Christian saint, and is thought to have lived in today's Turkey in the 3rd century. Having secretly become a Christian against her father's will, she was condemned to death by beheading. Her father himself carried out the death sentence. As punishment for this, he was struck by lightning and his body was consumed by flame. Barbara was buried by a Christian, Valentinus,



and her tomb became the site of miracles. Steeped in superstition, tunnellers draw on traditional beliefs as the work they carry out is in confined spaces and often very challenging and complex. No tunnelling project is complete without a nod to Saint Barbara.

At Hinkley Point C, this tradition is kept alive by placing a statue of Saint Barbara at the entrance to each tunnel before new work begins.

Lead Chaplain Ewen Huffman brought a timeless tradition to life at the Hinkley Point C Outfall Tunnel as he delivered a blessing in honour of Saint Barbara, the patron saint of miners.





• The boys at Brymore Academy expertly guided by Fiona Stanley, who help with the growing, planting and compost making that helps create our wonderful year-long displays.

We're making plans

Our enthusiastic volunteers are keen to build on this success, but equally to enjoy the journey. The bloomers are often seen leading the charge in community celebrations

(Cannington Christmas, plant and seed swaps and village events) and this remains a key focus -- engaging as many villagers as possible in enjoying our lovely village, together. We are planning more community initiatives (watch this space), working on new projects with partners, with a focus on community, sustainability and wildlife. So the remains of 2023 and 2024 look to be quite busy.





Cannington in Bloom receives a special award from the county



We were honoured to be given 'The 2023 Chair's Award for Service to the

Community' in acknowledgement for our contribution made to Cannington and the community. Steve and Jan Pettitt received the award on behalf of the team at a civic presentation 6 October.

The following citation was sent by the Parish Council to support Cannington in Bloom's nomination to the Somerset Council Chair reward.

Cannington in Bloom was officially formed in 2012. A small Committee has continued with many original members but many new ones over the last 11 years. They are a dedicated core, supplemented by many more who join in the weekly work activities and the horticultural team at Brymore School who grow many of the plants used. The "Bloomers" have become a key part of Cannington village life. "Weedy Wednesdays" and "Sustainable Saturdays" are weekly events in order to increase and maintain the village horticultural installations but in addition the general tidying and improving of public areas. Wider working parties are organised at intervals where the wider community are encouraged to join in with litter picking and maintenance such as bench painting. The Cannington in Bloom team have encouraged the Parish Council to look at the village in a different way and together with local businesses and individuals have supported the fundraising activities of the group with grants or donations. Parts of the village are entered for 'it's your neighbourhood' competitions

As part of the village community, members of Cannington in Bloom ensured that Cannington had 2022 Jubilee and 2023 Coronation events and supported the reinstated Christmas festivities, working with other groups to provide willow lantern making workshops for the children's parade. The Annual Front Garden Competition is arranged by Cannington in Bloom Members. This is a much wider participation in village life than taking part in the



Annual Britain in Bloom competitions, although the Gold awards stand as testimony to the success of their horticultural activities.







The Bridgwater Choral Society

History: The Choral Society has been at the heart of cultural life in Bridgwater since it was re-formed in 1949 by conductor Rex Browning, with the aim of providing music of quality from the classical choral repertoire in the town and district. The Society

has been fortunate to have been previously led by three outstanding conductors, Rex Browning, William Llewellyn, and Iain Cooper.

The Society was due to celebrate its 70th Anniversary when the Coronavirus (Covid-19) pandemic caused rehearsals and concerts to cease. Subsequently many choir members were unfortunately unable to return to rehearsals and in 2021 a further blow was dealt by the sudden resignation of conductor Iain Cooper.

<u>Harmonia - The Choir's New Lease of Life.</u> Following the resignation of Iain Cooper the future of the Society looked bleak. However, a dedicated group of singers did not wish to see the choir fold and resolved to try to keep the choir going in some form under the leadership of **Jackie Ayres**, a musician of wide experience. Appointed Head of Music in a London school, followed by another, where she established choirs and orchestras.

Throughout, she has been an accompanist, including masterclasses and recitals at Bristol University. Alongside these activities, she established and conducted for 25 years, a prize winning Youth orchestra, which played in Paris and London.

Jackie firmly believes in the importance of amateur music making to the highest possible standard, furthering the achievements of our predecessors, but at the same time, the incalculable contribution that making music together makes to our wellbeing. Developing the social aspect of the choir is very important to her, as well as presenting a wide variety of music.

As rehearsals resumed under Jackie's baton, it was decided to name this new group from within the Choral Society as **Harmonia** and this new group is going from strength to strength under Jackie's leadership. **We now rehearse at the Salvation Army Hall, Moorland Road, Bridgwater on Wednesday evenings from 7.00 – 9.00pm**. We are now a full 4 part choir again with an excellent balance, being fortunate to have a number of quality tenors and basses to match our experienced sopranos and altos. We are once again able to venture into the choral repertoire tackling pieces from Handel to Rutter. We are committed to the continuation of choral singing in the town and offering the opportunity for singers within our community to join our very friendly and sociable group.

We plan to hold several concerts annually and would welcome interest from anyone wishing to sing with us or to be part of our **Friends of Bridgwater Choral Society** which gives early information about our concerts and for a very small annual sum and free refreshments at our concerts.



Somerset Council work in partnership with Lendology CIC, a Social Enterprise lender, to provide council funded <u>0%</u> <u>Bulk Buy Fuel loans</u> to homeowners, social tenants, and private tenants to spread the cost over the winter months.

The loan can be used to purchase oil, gas, wood or other bulk-buy fuel sources and is repayable over six to twelve months. Lendology encourage residents to save alongside the loan where possible to create resilience in paying for the next bulk purchase. Lendology CIC (formerly Wessex Resolutions CIC) is a Social Enterprise working in partnership with Sedgemoor Council since 2005. We lend council funds to homeowners to fund home repairs, improvements, adaptations and energy efficiency measures. Our innovative scheme is a way for local councils to recycle their funds set aside for private homeowners, creating a sustainable funding stream.

As a Social Enterprise, we put people before profit and we work with our clients to take the stress out of funding essential home repairs. Reaching our client group across the areas we serve is greatly assisted with support from community-based organisations such as your own.

Private Fostering

Is your child living with another family?

Have you been looking after someone else's child for 28 days or more?

Do you know a child that's being looked after outside their close family?

If so, the child may be living in a private fostering arrangement.

The law says you must tell Children's Social Care if you know about any private fostering arrangements. This is so we can make sure the children are well looked after and to give support to their carers.

What is private fostering?

Private fostering is when a child or young person under 16 years old - or under 18 if they have a disability - lives with someone for 28 days or more who is not a close relative, guardian or person with parental responsibility. A close relative would be a parent, step-parent, aunt, uncle or grandparent.

People become private foster carers for all sorts of reasons. They might be a friend of the child's family. They could be someone who is willing to look after a child they do not know, for example if that child is on an exchange trip or have parents who live overseas.

If Children's Social Care has made the arrangement, or the person who is caring for the child is and approved foster carer, this is not private fostering.

What to do if you know of a private fostering arrangement

The law says you must tell Children's Social Care if you know about any private fostering arrangements.

If you think you are privately fostering a child or know about a child who is being privately fostered, then don't worry, it is allowed. But you do need to tell us - we have a legal duty to ensure that all children who are privately fostered are cared for in a safe and suitable environment.



Cathy's Pea Fritters

A Recipe using ingredients already in your cupboard and freezer. Suitable for students and those learning to cook. Nutritious, as peas are a secondary protein item and will fit tight budgets.

Ingredients

2 cups of frozen peas (defrost in microwave for 2 minutes) 2 tablespoons of oil (sunflower, olive oil, butter, vegan spread) Half cup of plain flour 2 eggs One teaspoon of salt

Half teaspoon of baking powder Chopped clove of peeled garlic Half teaspoon pepper

Cooking Method

Divide peas into 2.

Add one half of the peas to the eggs and garlic in a bowl. Mash up with a fork or a hand blender. Doesn't matter if its a bit lumpy.

After that add flour, baking powder, salt, pepper. Use a fork to fold and mix together. Add the second half of the whole peas. Stir in together leaving the peas whole.

Heat the oil in a frying pan on a medium heat then, using a dessert spoon, place four spoonfuls in the frying pan at once and cook until golden brown on one side, then flip over, using a knife and fork and cook the other side.


Serve hot or cold with a salad, bit of ketchup or plain yogurt. Serve as lunch, snack or supper. Makes 12 fritters.

Fresh herbs such as chives or mint can be chopped up and added into the first half of the peas.

If you like these, try using frozen sweetcorn niblets for Corn Fritters and add a bit of chopped up chilli.

For Carrot Fritters chop carrots into small squares and cover with water and then a lid on the saucepan and cook for 10 minutes first. Catherine Nightingale 7.10.23






What happened to the Yarn Bombing bits?



Catherine's Gardening Tips

Nov/Dec - perfect months for planting trees, either bare rooted (cheaper), and will not have any leaves showing or container bought. Monkton Elm garden centre on the way to

Taunton has an excellent selection and plenty of professional help at the wooden hut outside. More reasonable are the tree specialists outside Bristol, Chew Valley Trees, they deliver too.

Buy the largest you can afford, minimum size about the size of a broom handle. Ensure you order 1 to 3 bags of soil compost especially for trees, a bark guard to protect from errant strimmers, wooden tree stake and tree ties. (Small broom handle size trees will not need a stake).

When the weather is not frosty or the ground waterlogged gardening can start. Dig a square hole, three times as wide as the root ball. Make sure the tree(s) are kept watered until ready for planting. Place the tree into the hole. This is the last chance to choose which way round you prefer the branches. Ensure where the tree meets the soil is the same level as the surface level of hole, otherwise it risks suffocating the new tree. If using a tree stake, place on the west side, just outside the





root ball, push down firmly or use a mallet. The prevailing wind is from the west and this holds the root ball in place until the new tree's roots are established (two years). Mix the tree compost with ordinary garden soil. Fill in the sides of the hole, treading lightly to make sure there are no air pockets which would lead to roots drying out underground. Keep a depression a bit like a dustbin lid on the surface this makes it easy to trap the water. Tread surface lightly.


> If using a stake, attach the tree tie with a nail and tie around the trunk of your new tree. Water really well, four x 5 litre watering cans worth. The tree will be dormant until end of March. Then it will need the same amount of water as above weekly, for two years, in dry weather in spring and summer. Soon your

tree will attract birds, insects, butterflies and bees depending on variety, who will either shelter there or enjoy nectar from flowers. Trees have a far more important role than previously thought by scientists. They absorb nearly twice as much carbon in their trunks and branches than previous calculations.

Also this is the best time to plant clematis and various spring bulbs and tulips.

January - prune dead, dying (bark is brown if scratched with thumb nail) damage, diseased wood and any crossing inwards or rubbing other branches. Those plants that flower after mid-summer, cut flowers off in winter. We definitely have a thriving hedgehog and slow worm community in the village so if you can try to keep leaf piles and wood piles undisturbed as you may be lucky enough to have a hedgehog or slow worm hibernating in your garden. They are brilliant because they include slugs in their diet. Catherine Nightingale 8.10.23

Conveyancing Conundrums

Amicus Law Welcome to a new monthly column where I will answer reader questions SOLICITORS on all manner of conveyancing matters!

What is conveyancing? Conveyancing is the legal transfer of property or land from one owner to another.

What is a conveyancer? A Conveyancer is someone who can help you through the process of selling, buying or mortgaging a property.

Who needs a conveyancer? It is recommended that sellers and purchasers appoint a conveyancer to deal with their matter, they can provide expert legal advice regarding a range of property related services.

This column is, of course, no substitute for obtaining legal advice and can only give generic advice that may be of use and interest to a number of readers.

What does "registered land" and "unregistered land" mean?

HM Land Registry was set up in 1862 to record the ownership of land and any interests affecting the land (such as a mortgage). Until then, buyers and sellers had to rely on physical title deeds and mortgage deeds to prove that the person selling a piece of land had the right to do so and this, of course, could lead to all sorts of complications if deeds were lost or not disclosed.

Registration was initially voluntary, but by 1990 it was made compulsory for any piece of land sold (or mortgaged) in England or Wales to be registered with HMLR. Currently around 88% of the land mass of England and Wales is registered with HMLR, so there are still a significant number of properties that are unregistered. Within our local villages there are a lot of unregistered properties, as many houses have been owned by the same individuals for decades.

If you own a property that is unregistered, it is worth considering getting it registered now as the process can take up to 1 year to complete. If you then decide that you want to sell, it will make the sale process much quicker if it is already registered. Also, for those who will inherit the property, it will make the process much easier for them if they don't need to hunt for title deeds as part of a probate sale. You can check on gov.uk to see if your property is registered or not.

What Next?




