Following the widespread effects of the recent storms and gales, both on the coast and inland, we would like to stress the importance of reporting flooding. If your home or business has flooded, please make sure you report it as soon as you are able to. There are lots of reasons why you should report flooding, most importantly so authorities and agencies can respond to close roads, unblock gullies, and provide an emergency response if required.

While we do have a significant number of staff out on the ground, due to the scale of the event we were unable to cover all areas. We are seeking to build a comprehensive picture of impacts across Wessex so we would be very grateful if you could provide any available information regarding flooding in your area with as much detail as possible on timing and location. Please report online using the <u>Flood Online Reporting Tool</u> or you can respond by contacting the Environment Agency Incident

Hotline on 0800 80 70 60.

In an emergency please dial 999.

Useful information includes:

*Residential and commercial properties that are known to have flooded

*Road, rail or other transport infrastructure affected

*Any photos or videos of the above and inundated areas of floodplains Find out more <u>Blog: The Importance of Reporting Flooding</u> | The Flood Hub

Our advice to the public is to:

• Stay safe and not enter floodwater.

• Stay away from seafronts, quaysides and jetties, due to the risk of overtopping by waves.

• Call Floodline on **0345 988 1188** for updates on flooding, to sign up for flood warnings, or to report flooding.

• Go to the Gov.uk website or search 'know my flood risk' to sign up for Environment Agency flood warnings, receive information on the risk in your area and what to do in a flood.



Weather report for October - December

October like September was a warmer and wetter month than average. The daytime and night-time averages of 17.7c and 10.2c were some two and a half degrees above normal. Rainfall of 111mm was 34mm above average, making it the wettest month by far this year.



The 13th and the 18th were the wettest days, with 20.6mm and 22.4mm being recorded. The total for the year so far is 619mm. This is 26mm above what we would expect in the first ten months of an average year.

November continued the trend of the last few months, being warmer and wetter than average, although an easterly wind brought us some colder weather and two air frosts during the last few days. Daytime and night-time averages were 12.4c and 6.8c. These were about a degree above normal figures. The recorded rainfall was 102.4mm. This is about a third more than a normal November. The total for the year so far of 722mm is 50mm over average.

December, like November was wetter and warmer than average. The first few days saw the only air frosts of the month then the milder weather set in. The daily highs averaged 11.2c some three degrees higher than normal. Lows were similarly well above average at 7.2c. There was one particularly wet day. 20mm was recorded on the 4th. The monthly total of 88.4mm was just 6mm above the average.



2023 as well as being one of the warmest on record was the wettest we have had for some time. The annual total of 811mm was 56mm above average. Our wettest day was the 17th September when we recorded 28.4mm. Our highest temperature was only 28.1c on July the 7th; we have often recorded over 30c in earlier years. **David Daggar**







If your collection day is changing you should have received a letter in the post.

Make sure to take a note of the day and be ready to put your boxes out on your new day from 12 February.

We'll be sending out calendars soon!

All the costs for sending information out about the changes to collection days are being met by our contractor. This is at no cost to Somerset Council, and the change to collections should be more efficient, reliable and less carbon-intensive.

Everyone (in phase one) will get a service guide with collection day calendar at the end of the month, but only those with a changing collection day or change to the week that rubbish is collected will get a letter in advance of that.

It's really important that people know their collection days - direct mailing is still the best way to get information to everyone, including those not online, and writing twice makes sure that people affected are looking out for their calendar and don't miss it when it comes.







Power cut safety advice

If you're in touch with anyone in your area who is experiencing power issues, please share our advice below. You can also find information on our social media channels:- <u>Facebook</u>, <u>Twitter/X</u>, <u>Threads</u> and <u>Instagram</u>.

If you are affected by a power cut, it is the Electricity Distribution Network Operator (DNO) who is responsible for maintaining physical electricity supplies to your home or business; you can contact your local DNO by calling 105.

*If you need to light your home when you're without power, we would prefer if you used torches and battery-powered candles rather than candles. If you must use candles, follow our <u>candle safety advice</u>.

*Don't try and cook using barbecues or using fires inside your home such as wood-burners.

*Turn off any appliances that may be a fire risk if they switch on when the power comes back on (such as hair dryers or electric hobs).

*If you're using a portable heater such as oil or gas, keep it a good distance (at least 1 metre) from people or furniture. Do not cover them with anything that could catch fire such as clothing. **Devon and Somerset Fire and Rescue Service**



The law says you must tell Children's Social Care if you know about any private fostering arrangements. This is so we can make sure the children are well looked after and to give support to their carers.

What is private fostering?

Private fostering is when a child or young person under 16 years old - or under 18 if they have a disability - lives with someone for 28 days or more who is not a close relative, guardian or person with parental responsibility. A close relative would be a parent, step-parent, aunt, uncle or grandparent.

People become private foster carers for all sorts of reasons. They might be a friend of the child's family. They could be someone who is willing to look after a child they do not know, for example if that child is on an exchange trip or have parents who live overseas.

If Children's Social Care has made the arrangement, or the person who is caring for the child is and approved foster carer, this is not private fostering.

What to do if you know of a private fostering arrangement

The law says you must tell Children's Social Care if you know about any private fostering arrangements.

If you think you are privately fostering a child or know about a child who is being privately fostered, then don't worry, it is allowed. But you do need to tell us - we have a legal duty to ensure that all children who are privately fostered are cared for in a safe and suitable environment.

Quantock Hills National Landscape



Grants for community-led nature projects still available from the Quantock Hills National Landscape!

The Greater Quantock Landscape Development Fund (GQLDF) is funded by EDF and supports community-based projects that mitigate the impact of the Hinkley Point C development. It is delivered by the Quantock Hills National Landscape Team but covers the area most severely impacted by HPC, so the eligible area is different to the QHNL boundary.

The GQLDF scheme launched in 2014, and we have since supported 55 projects. Although we only have 2% of our original budget left to allocate, we are still keen to develop new projects with community groups looking to deliver tree, orchard and hedge planting, restoration of ponds and wildflower meadows and small-scale woodland management. You could receive a grant of up to £5,000 towards your project, or 75% of your costs.



GIGGLE CAKE

INGREDIENTS

2 tsp melted butter for greasing 350g/12oz mixed dried fruit 125g/4 1/4oz butter or margarine 175g/6oz soft brown sugar 225g/8oz self-raising flour Pinch of salt 2 eggs beaten 225g/8oz canned chopped pineapple, drained 125g/4 1/4oz glace cherries halved



1) Put mixed fruit in a bowl and cover with boiling water, set aside for 10 to 15 minutes and then drain

2) Put the butter or margarine in saucepan with sugar and heat gently until melted. Add the drained fruit and cook over a low heat stirring frequently for 4 to 5 minutes. Remove from the heat and transfer into a mixing bowl. Set aside to cool.

3) Sift flour and salt into fruit mixture and stir well. Add the eggs and mix unil thoroughly mixed.

4) Add pineapple and cherries to the mixture and thoroughly stir. Transfer into a lined / greased round or oblong 1kg/2lb 7 inch cake tin.

5) Bake cake in a preheated oven 180c/350f /gas mark 4 for about 1 hour, test with a skewer. If it comes out clean it is cooked. If not return to oven for a few more minutes.
6) Leave to cool



Tips for your gardens in February - March - April

February

- Place new potatoes (first earlies) on a window sill in egg boxes to chit
- Soak Sweet Pea seeds for a week, then put 4 seeds to a small pot of compost (vermiculite, sharp sand, or perlite and compost mixed)
- Sow marigold seeds
- Scrape soil from mole hills and use as readymade, naturally sieved compost for seed sowing and planting (a way to work with wildlife, rather than use chemicals or killing moles)
- Keep feeding wild birds and give fresh water every day
- Using secateurs, cut wisteria tendrils down to 10cm (4")
- When not too wet and not frosty, use the garden fork prongs to make holes in your lawn to aerate the soil and create better drainage
- Make patios safe and ready for spring, by giving them a good clean using water with a power washer
- Order any flower and vegetable seeds

<u>March</u>



- Scrub bird tables early in day with very weak disinfectant solution to protect from disease.
 - Clean out bird boxes.
 - Bury some wood for stag beetle larvae. They take eight years to mare.
 - Sow seeds thinly. Keep moist and warm in either cold greenhouse or light windowsill or window box.
- Good Friday. Plant new potatoes 25 cm (1 foot) apart, rows 50 cm (2 foot) apart and 10 cm (4") deep. Water really well every week. Ready for harvesting mid July.

<u>April</u>

- Make an insect hotel. Mason bee home. Lacewing and butterfly homes. Look at ideas on internet for bug and insect charities. Great for children and families to do to get into looking after essential bugs and wildlife.
- Divide allotment into Roots, Legumes, Potatoes & Squashes, Brassicas, Wildflowers, Fruit and Fallow spaces
- Hoe and hand remove annual weeds. Keep a few dandelions as these are the first flower food for emerging bees and insects after the long dark winter.
- Keep a scruffy corner in your space for insects, mammals and amphibians; wood pile, nettles, twigs, compost pile, dead tree trunk and root (Catherine Nightingale)




commenting on their outstanding behaviour. Our sincere thanks go to one of our parents who kindly donated £200 towards the coach hire to make this happen.

Speed Indicator device (SID)


Apologies for these belated results, but we are having technical issues downloading the information we need, and, despite contacting the French manufacturers, we are still continuing to have problems accessing the figures.


