Origins of the Child of Cannington

Cannington Hill is believed to be the site of some kind of shrine or mausoleum which is thought to have been late Roman and stood on the hill top, surrounded by a number of graves with many more graves further down the slope of the hill. The cemetery may have held



anything up to a thousand graves, and may have been pagan in its earliest phases but was largely Christian and was in use from the 4th to the late 7th or early 8th century.

What makes the cemetery special was one particular grave which appears to have been especially venerated, covered by a small mound of earth on its surface, stone slabs formed into a box-like structure, at the east end were stones set as posts, one of which was decorated with a circular motif and perhaps runes. The grave contained the remains of a young girl aged about 16 years of age. A well-used path led to the mound, here was



evidently a venerated spot, often visited and close to which people wanted to be buried. We will never know who the young girl was but her remains were re-interred in the Parish Church, and her burial place can be found at the base of the pulpit steps.

A stone slab marking the tomb bears the inscription "Child of Cannington". She is immortalised by a wooden statue which is placed on a pillar facing the tomb, with facial features based on the child's skull. Every year a small replica of the Statue is presented to a resident nominated for

their service to the village. Sadly due to extensive quarrying no trace of the cemetery can be seen today. (Extract from "Cannington Reflections" a book that celebrates the Millennium)

Weather Report

April was a warmer than average month with day and nighttime temperatures of 14.4c and 4.8c being a degree or so above average. We recorded 39.5mm of rain, some 12mm below average.



About half of this fell in the first ten days with most of the rest in the last four so giving us a dry spell midmonth.

May continued the trends set in April with day and nighttime temperatures being a degree or so above average. They were 19c and 9.6c respectively. The rainfall was quite evenly spread with the total of 54mm being just 2mm over normal.



June opened by being unseasonably chilly, however high pressure arrived at the end of the month bringing us temperatures in the twenties [28.6c on the 26th] so our monthly daytime average of 19.4c matched the long-term average almost exactly. The nighttime average of 9.8c was about a

degree below the normal. Overall, it was a dry month. We recorded 16.4mm, about a third of what we might expect. Most of this fell between the 10th and the 14th.


able to attend as they were busy being sworn in as churchwardens at the same time. Our picture below shows the D Day ringers.



By the time you read this article, Cannington will have been judged in both the regional and national Britain in Bloom competitions, so now the waiting for our results begins. You will have noticed lots of activities over the last few weeks, involving volunteers, community groups, households and businesses. Thank you to everyone who helped make Cannington look its best. This year Cannington in Bloom has focused on three key areas: sustainability, community and the regeneration of 'neglected' areas.

SUSTAINABILITY

To help conserve water we have replaced most of the badly deteriorated wooden barrels with new sustainable planters with water reservoirs, some of which have been funded by the Parish council and others from Cannington in Bloom fundraising which includes donations from local businesses and the community.

Cannington in Bloom also encourage habitats that support biodiversity. One area we are very proud of is the new Woodland corner at Clifford Park with new homes built for bees, other insects and slow worms. This project was run by one of our team in conjunction with the Brownies and URC eco club.

COMMUNITY

We have a year-round planning cycle with key events such as our summer Community Volunteer day, Cannington Christmas fair, our Spring seed and plant swap and sale and local competitions. Our successful Flower Pot Friends competition resulted in over 40 entries – you may have spotted some around the village. Our 'art in the community' campaign has also encouraged a tide of creativity... resulting in art installations around the village and the bus stop mural.

REGENERATION

Several areas that have been challenging in the past are now looking amazing – these include the woodland corner at Clifford Park, school path and Portland close. All are now transformed and tended by individuals and community groups – with Bloomers help. We'd like to encourage more 'local action' to help regenerate unloved parts of the village, so please get in touch if there's an area near you that you'd like help with.

pulling together to showcase our wonderful village to the judges. It looked magnificent. All the flower pot friends, the Brownies' bees and other art installations helped to brighten up the village and show a wonderful community spirit. Well done to everyone.

We do not want you to think that the Parish Council only keeps the village looking good for the judging. We are striving to keep the village clean and tidy throughout the year. With the help of the Community Payback team, we have been able to tackle a number of projects. We are always looking for additional jobs for them, so if you are aware of an area that needs a bit of TLC, then please contact the Clerks or any of your Councillors.

We will also be carrying out a survey of street name signs to see which ones need refurbishing/replacing.

Pump Track

The pump track at Rodway has not been forgotten, the time scale has slipped and it is now hoped for the work to commence in September.

Cannington Brook

Concerns have been raised about the volume of vegetation in the brook around the main road bridge. The Council have now got the necessary exemptions from the Environment Agency to clear this and it will be undertaken by the end of September.

20 mph

If you are not already aware, Cannington Parish Council applied for a Community Funded 20 mph speed limit in Cannington. Statutory notices were published and no objections to the scheme were received. We have not yet received details of when this scheme will be implemented.

Dog Fouling

This problem just isn't going away. We really need all dog owners to be responsible and pick up after their dogs. It only takes one or two to spoil it for everyone. It is the one thing that lets our village down.

Highways Improvements

We have been informed that during the 2024/25 financial year, Cannington Straight and Sandford Hill will be surface dressed and a drainage scheme implemented on Sandford Hill.

Dog fouling is a constant problem in the village, and it's not the dog's fault, they are only doing what comes naturally. 



Private Fostering

Is your child living with another family?

Have you been looking after someone else's child for 28 days or more?

Do you know a child that's being looked after outside their close family?

If so, the child may be living in a private fostering arrangement.

The law says you must tell Children's Social Care if you know about any private fostering arrangements. This is so we can make sure the children are well looked after and to give support to their carers.

What is private fostering?

Private fostering is when a child or young person under 16 years old - or under 18 if they have a disability - lives with someone for 28 days or more who is not a close relative, guardian or person with parental responsibility. A close relative would be a parent, step-parent, aunt, uncle or grandparent.

People become private foster carers for all sorts of reasons. They might be a friend of the child's family. They could be someone who is willing to look after a child they do not know, for example if that child is on an exchange trip or have parents who live overseas.

If Children's Social Care has made the arrangement, or the person who is caring for the child is and approved foster carer, this is not private fostering.

What to do if you know of a private fostering arrangement

The law says you must tell Children's Social Care if you know about any private fostering arrangements.

If you think you are privately fostering a child or know about a child who is being privately fostered, then don't worry, it is allowed. But you do need to tell us - we have a legal duty to ensure that all children who are privately fostered are cared for in a safe and suitable environment.



Cathy's Gardening Tips

<u>Aug</u> - The Swifts have been wheeling above Cannington's skies before flying back to South Africa with their young. They do not stop flying for five years, then they pick a nest site about 4 metres from the ground. So if you have space on an east facing wall, which is a fine opportunity to put up a swift nesting box. It is an offence under Section 1 of the Wildlife and Countryside Act of 1981 to intentionally hurt wild



birds between March and August. They are protected. The first week of August may be the time to consider a first cut of hedges. Check first that they are empty of wild birds' nesting. Put all waste in your Compost Bin. The next best time for hedge cutting is the last week of September, allowing them to get a bit of green growth before the first frost in October.

Prepare new strawberry bed. Mornings: Weed & deadhead flowers. Evenings: Feed, water from your water butt, mulch, top up ponds with hose on fine spray. Chop 500g (1lb) tomato leaves, steep overnight with 1ltr (2 pts) water, strain & spray for aphids & red spider mite at dusk. Deter cats & slugs with chopped citrus peel. Hollowed out grapefruit & orange trap slugs. Use plain unprinted cardboard, be sure to remove the sellotape. Cover with 10 cm (4") compost as a mulch. Trim wisteria tendrils to width of your hand. Water new trees weekly, 15 ltr (3 gal) min. Order spring bulbs.

<u>Sep</u> - Sow swiss chard, winter salad leaves. Cut down wildflowers & leave cuttings for a week then it is important to remove them. This stops the soil from getting any nutrients from the cuttings. Trim hedges last week of the month. Harvest beans, marrow, courgettes, carrots, and autumn raspberries. Cut off summer fruiting blackberry and raspberries canes at ground level, tie in the new growth.

<u>Oct</u> - Sow broad beans & peas, wildflowers, garlic & onion sets. Harvest & store carrots in dry sand. On a sunny day, dig up all main crop potatoes, dry on the ground for a few hours, rub off loose soil and store in paper or hessian sacks in a dark cupboard. Leave cabbage, kale parsnips & sprouts in the ground, best to harvest after the first frost. Pick borlotti & haricot beans in their pods & place in a basket to dry in a cool shed, then pod and store. For No Dig gardening, weed deterrent & better for soil composition and earth worms, weed and cover soil in 5cm (2") farm manure. Cover with Industrial Very Thick Plastic (not the thin plastic which breaks down into tiny bits and is an environmental hazard). Break roots of rhubarb to size of fist and plant 1m (3') part in manured soil. Dig up tomato plants, hang upside down in greenhouse & allow fruits to ripen, those still green, put in a drawer with a banana or make chutney. Plant spring bulbs 4 x their size deep, pointed end up. Mulch flower beds. **Catherine Nightingale 11.7.24**

Gas Mark 3 (325 degrees) for 25 minutes in two buttered and

greaseproof lined 7 inch sandwich tins

3oz / 85 gm demerara sugar

6oz / 170 gm self-rising flour

3 eggs - room temperature

1 rounded teaspoon baking powder

6oz / 170 gm unsalted butter

2oz / 50 gm desiccated coconut

2 level tablespoons dried coconut milk powder

Zest and juice of two limes

Make the sponge as a Victoria sponge. My way is to separate the eggs. Beat the egg whites until stiff with peaks first and put aside in a large separate clean bowl. Beat warm butter and sugar together until creamy and fluffy. Add egg yolks gradually. Beat in desiccated coconut, coconut milk powder and limes and zest. Add egg whites. Fold in flour and baking powder.

Divide into two sandwich tins and level carefully with a pallet knife. Cooked when slightly risen and golden brown. Turn out onto two cooling racks, remove greaseproof papers and leave to cool completely.

<u>Icing</u>

8oz sieved icing sugar

3 limes (the zest of one will be used to decorate the icing on top of the cake) Segment the three limes, removing all the membrane & pith and keeping as much juice as possible. Mix with icing sugar slowly, put half in the sandwich and half on top.






