Editorial

Samuel Taylor Coleridge

He was born in Ottery St Mary, Devon, on 21st October 1772, the youngest son of 13 children. He had 3 older stepsisters and an older stepbrother John. His father died when he was eight. He was educated at Christ's Hospital School in London and at Jesus College, Cambridge, but got into debt and did not take his degree. He enlisted in the 15th Light Dragoons as 'Silas Tomkyn Comberbache' to avoid college debts but was bought out later by a brother under the 'insanity' clause. At first briefly, a Unitarian minister in Shrewsbury he won backing from Thomas and Josiah Wedgewood (£150 a year) which allowed him to leave the ministry.

Writing poetry while working as a journalist on the

Morning Post, he later became Secretary to the Governor of Malta and then a freelance lecturer. He collaborated with William Wordsworth in writing Lyrical Ballads and The Rime of the Ancient Mariner and numerous translations, plays and philosophical and critical writings

Coleridge fell in love with Sara Hutchinson but was rejected by her, reflected in the poem 'Dejection Ode'. In 1795 he married Sarah Fricker, by whom he fathered four children. His friend married Sarah's sister Edith.

Dorothy Wordsworth described Coleridge on their first meeting as 'Pale and thin, has a wide mouth, thick lips and not very good teeth; longish hair, rough black hair. His eye (sic) is large and full, not dark but grey, with fine eyebrows'. Later in life he became very fat, usually shabbily dressed.

A brilliant public speaker and conversationalist, Coleridge was vain and enjoyed looking at himself but was addressed as Coleridge by the Wordsworths and even by his wife.

Coleridge was addicted to opium in its liquid form, laudanum, and by 1814 he was drinking two quarts of it a week. He suffered from rheumatism and neuralgic headaches

and complained 'I cannot breathe through my nose, so my mouth is almost always open'. Further physical ailments included eye infections, rheumatic fever and gout.

Coleridge had only had one poem published at 21. He composed nearly 300 lines of Kublai Khan during a three hour sleep in a farmhouse after reading about Kublai Khan in Purchas's Pilgrimage - he woke up and wrote down 54 lines before being interrupted, and found he had forgotten the rest.

The Rime of the Ancient Mariner began when he was walking with Wordsworth near Lynmouth, and was published in 1798.

He died of heart failure at the London house of his surgeon friend in London, on the 25th July 1834 aged 61. An autopsy revealed an enlarged heart and liver and a cyst on the lungs.

Delivering Better Bus Services - Ashley Fox MP

One of the most common complaints I hear from residents is about buses. Whether it's services not turning up, long gaps between buses, or entire communities being left without any access to public transport, it's clear the system hasn't been working as it should.

That's why, not long after I was elected, I made it a priority to listen to people's experiences and to take action. I launched a survey to gather

people's experiences and to take action. I launched a survey to gather feedback directly from residents across Bridgwater and Burnham-on-Sea.

I met with First Bus and Somerset Council to present the findings. I pressed for practical changes—better reliability, more frequent services, and coverage that meets the needs of our growing communities. I also raised specific problem routes, including the number 21 service between Burnham and Taunton, and areas like Wilstock, Puriton and Chilton Trinity which are underserved or completely left out.

Following these conversations and the lobbying that followed, Somerset has allocated significant new funding under the Government's Bus Service Improvement Plan to the Bridgwater Constituency. This should bring real, tangible improvements to our local transport network.

These include extending the 21 service that runs from Burnham-on-Sea to Taunton, increasing the frequency of the B1 Bridgwater Town Service and introducing a Sunday service. We'll also see upgrades to traffic signals in Bridgwater to give buses priority, a feasibility study for a new transport hub in the town, and improved access for buses at Bridgwater Train Station.

Another particularly welcome development is the expansion of Digital Demand Responsive Transport (DDRT) to the Sedgemoor Slinky service. This flexible transport option has real potential to benefit residents in more rural parts of the constituency, where running a regular bus service isn't always practical.

But while this is good progress, I'm under no illusion that the job is done. Rural communities still face significant transport challenges. For many people living in villages or on the edge of town, the bus simply isn't a viable option—either it doesn't run often enough, or it doesn't come at all. We need to do more to support these areas and ensure that no one is left behind.


That means continuing to push for investment, exploring new transport models, and making the most of technology to deliver smarter, more responsive services. It also means keeping up the pressure—on both operators and the council—to make sure improvements are delivered as promised.

If you've had a good—or bad—experience with your local bus, I want to hear from you. Your voice helps shape the case I put forward on your behalf.

Pump Track

The pump track has become a great addition to the village and it has really encouraged outdoor activity and community engagement. The Council are planning an official opening once the VE Day celebrations are over.

20 mph

Hello Shaun

I'm an avid reader of The Cannington Target and always pleased when it's delivered. It's full of interesting and useful local news. So, I was surprised and disappointed to find an EdeF publicity puff for Hinkley Point C (HPC) taking up two thirds of a page in the February 2025 edition.

For balance, here's a few reminders of why HPC isn't as great as EdeF would like us to believe.

We need new electricity generation sooner rather than later as we get rid of fossil fuels and old nuclear power stations go offline. Despite EdeF's ludicrous claim that HPC would be cooking our Christmas turkeys by 2017, its firm commitment to a 2025 completion also proved wildly optimistic. HPC won't be working anytime soon and even 2031 now looks dubious for when it might start up.

As electricity from renewables gets ever cheaper, the agreed price of already expensive HPC electricity just goes on rising with inflation. And, if HPC ever works, we have to pay that price 24/7, however low the spot market price of electricity.

The workforce will soon be up to 15,000 workers, a tripling of the 5,600 forecast. Fly Parking in Cannington, a regular local irritant, can only get worse. And the pressure on the local housing market caused by HPC's Gold Rush economy makes it even harder for people to rent, let alone buy, their first home.

EdeF makes much of how many HPC workers are 'local', which to you and me means Bridgwater at best, Somerset at worse. The fact is that anyone within 90 minutes' drive time of a HPC Park & Ride is classed as local. So, are workers from Cardiff and Plymouth 'locals'?


As long as there's the light pollution, we'll never see the Northern Lights from Cannington.



Some facts about the 1500s: (Thanks to Geoff Parle and the Coleridge Probus Club mag)

Most people got married in June because they took their yearly bath in May, and they still smelled pretty good by June. However, since they were starting to smell, brides carried a bouquet of flowers to hide the body odour. Hence the custom today of carrying a bouquet when getting married. Baths consisted of a big tub filled with hot water. The man of the house had the privilege of the nice clean water,



then all the other sons and men, then the women and finally the children. Last of all the babies. By then the water was so dirty you could actually lose someone in it. Hence the saying, "Don't throw the baby out with the Bath water!"

Lead cups were used to drink ale or whisky. The combination would Sometimes knock the imbibers out for a couple of days. Someone walking along the road would take them for dead and prepare them for burial. They were laid out on the kitchen table for a couple of days and the family would gather around and eat and drink and wait and see if they would wake up. Hence the custom of holding a wake.

Bread was divided according to status. Workers got the burnt bottom of the loaf, the family got the middle, and guests got the top, or the upper crust.

Houses had thatched roofs-thick straw-piled high, with no wood underneath. It was the only place for animals to get warm, so all the cats and other small animals (mice, bugs) lived in the roof. When it rained it became slippery and sometimes the animals would slip and fall off the roof... Hence the saying "It's raining cats and dogs."





What is private fostering?

Private fostering is when a child or young person under 16 years old - or under 18 if they have a disability - lives with someone for 28 days or more who is not a close relative, guardian or person with parental responsibility. A close relative would be a parent, step-parent, aunt,

People become private foster carers for all sorts of reasons. They might be a friend of the child's family. They could be someone who is willing to look after a child they do not know, for example if that child is on an exchange trip or have parents who live overseas.

If Children's Social Care has made the arrangement, or the person who is caring for the child is and approved foster carer, this is not private

What to do if you know of a private fostering arrangement

The law says you must tell Children's Social Care if you know about any private fostering arrangements.

If you think you are privately fostering a child or know about a child who need to tell us - we have a legal duty to ensure that all children who are privately fostered are cared for in a safe and suitable environment.



Yarn Bombers - Can you remember the two panels the Yarn Bombers created as part of a D-Day exhibition that started in France? The exhibition consisted of 80 panels, each of which was 1 metre long. Our panels told the story of American troops being stationed at Brymore before they left to take part in D-Day. The exhibition successfully toured the UK and most of us were fortunate to see it in different locations. The panels have now travelled across the Atlantic and are now in America at the Naval Air Station Wildwood Aviation Museum, Cape May and will be at various locations for the next year.

This year, as part of the VE Day celebrations another 80 panels are being created showing life in the UK during the war. As the Bombers are gluttons for punishment we have made two more panels. One shows a street party based on an original photograph taken in Nottinghamshire. The other features the Bevin Boys, sometimes known as the Forgotten Conscripts, who were selected to work underground mining coal between December 1943 and March 1948 to increase the rate of coal production.

Cathy's Gardening Tips


May - Early this month, there is still time to sow flower and vegetable seeds and to plant seed potatoes. Tie in new shoots on clematis, continue successional sowing of salad crops and herbs. Sow cauliflower, leeks and sprouting broccoli for harvesting next winter.

Earth up and create ridges over potatoes when the shoots are 20cm (8") high. Water brassicas well to encourage strong growth. Pinch out tips of broad beans to minimise and control blackfly. At Whitsun plant out bedding plants, dahlias and Canna Lilies, also dead

head wallflowers and tulips. You should keep Ponds and water features topped up. Clean pond filters and use grilles over ponds to protect children. Remove blanket weed and floating weeds as soon as they appear.

Avoid feeding birds with peanuts as they could choke fledglings. Keep bird baths clean and filled with fresh water

as Bird flu has been devastating across the world. The majority of baby birds fledge around 25th of the month, so if it is important to you where possible keep cats in just for

Those plants that flower before mid summer, cut flowers off after flowering. Those that flower after mid summer, cut flowers off in winter. Water potatoes well once a week, in the evening. Tadpoles will be tiny frogs by now so watch where treading in the garden. Plant the following for bees - Rosemary, Mahonia, Perovskia, Lavender, Pulmonaria, Hardy Geranium, Sedum, Ribes (Flowering current), Majoram, Sunflowers, Nasturtium, Lupin and Catmint (Nepeta) and try and leave some Dandelions; bees need and love them.

July - Just enjoy your garden. Water in the evening. Deadhead. Hand weed. In April we had so many Hover Bees, Queen bees looking for nest sites and even Peacock butterflies. Sadly no frog spawn this year. Early potatoes are ready when the leaves start yellowing. Eat tiny with unsalted butter and sea salt. Delicious! Catherine Nightingale 6.4.25

What is an Acoustic Fish Deterrent (AFD)?


AFDs are needed to guide and deter fish from entering cooling water intakes, protecting both the fish populations and the infrastructure of facilities like nuclear power plants, while ensuring sustainable and efficient operations. These are placed at the opening of the water intakes at nuclear power stations. The intakes at HPC will suck in an Olympic swimming pool worth of water every 12 seconds, more than the normal flow of all the rivers flowing into the Severn Estuary.

The type proposed for HPC uses a Sound Projector Array, a system of underwater speakers that produce a repellent sound gradient to block intakes. Species such as Atlantic salmon and twaite shad, which are abundant in the Severn Estuary and of high conservation importance, have responded particularly well to existing AFDs.

- The specific frequencies and power can vary depending on the system and the targeted specific fish species that may be attracted to cooling water intakes.
- AFDs are considered a more effective and an environmentally friendly alternative to physical screens for filtering out fish and debris from cooling water intakes, especially for fragile species that may not survive the return process.
- In January 2024, a consultation on the idea of replacing the AFD with a salt marsh was widely rejected by the public and environmental organisations
- An AFD was tested in Hartlepool, where local seal populations were monitored with no effect on their behaviour (AFD sounds at 1,000 Hz, peak range of sea mammal hearing is 20,000 Hz)..

Natalie's Slow cooked Roast Chicken

Method

Put your chicken in a large roasting pan. Inside the chicken, put big chunks of onions and rosemary/thyme, then put over the chicken, a thin layer of mustard, Provence herbs, salt and pepper. Sprinkle some olive oil onto the chicken, and then add at the bottom of the roasting pan, about 1cm of water.

Put in the oven at 110 / 120,° Gas mark 4, for about 2 hours. Remove from oven and turn chicken over, add more mustard, a bit more oil all over, and use the juice to baste the chicken. Add a little more water to make sure there is juice at the



bottom and then put back in the oven. Increase the temperature to 150,° Gas mark 5 for another 30-40mins.

Prepare some big potatoes chunks, pre-cook them for 4 minutes in boiling water. Put them to the side and when the chicken is slightly roasted (after the 30/40mins), turn it over, and pour juice all over the chicken. Add the potatoes around it (in the juice), sprinkle them with dry garlic, Provence herbs and salt, and sprinkle a little olive oil over them. Turn oven to 200-210° Gas mark 7 to Gas mark 8. The potatoes will roast at the top and be tender underneath with a nice juicy taste. The chicken will then roast and the potatoes too and when the potatoes and chicken are crispy, it is ready.

I like this recipe as it doesn't make my oven dirty and it makes the chicken really soft and tender. **Nathalie Louis-Andre 7th April 2025**







